Special Gifts—Updated September 2017

The following items could not be funded through the annual budgeting channels because of the limited amount of revenue generated in a year. These items remain needed and hopefully a parishioner or group of parishioners might be interested in funding one or more privately. The estimated cost of each item is provided. Funding of any item would be much appreciated. Please contact the Parish Office if interested or simply drop your *clearly noted* contribution in the collection basket.

- 1. *THANK YOU!* \$40, 169.85 Raised/Received! Install electronic marquee on 36th Street est. \$50K The marketing of St Matthew to the thousands of people who pass by on 36th Street each day would be extremely beneficial to the parish. Payback would come in welcoming new parishioner families, additional participation in fish fries, generating more students for the school, etc. It could be our billboard to others as well as a source of information to our own parishioners
- **2.** *THANK YOU!* \$6000 Received! Rectory repairs \$8,500 There are many repairs needed on the exterior of the rectory to include (but not limited to): replace/repair siding, trim chimney surround, chimney cap, fascia cover, caulk, prime and paint materials. These costs are for all work to be accomplished by parish volunteers, with the exception of a project manager. The project manager is a well-qualified and experienced contractor that has been selected by our Minutemen.
- **3.** Concrete pad for dumpsters est. \$5K A concrete pad is needed to prevent any further damage to our asphalt caused by the heavy garbage trucks that service us.
- 4. New computers for our teachers est. \$10K Our school has received a \$95K grant from the Archdiocese of Omaha~Ignite the Faith Fund, for Network Infrastructure Upgrades, cabling, switches and access points. New computers are needed to take advantage of the new infrastructure, enhance technology in the classrooms and give teachers a portable device for professional development days. There is also a giving tree located near the school offices for this effort.
- **5.** Replace/repair windows in the Rectory est. \$15K This is a required maintenance item but would also contribute to lower utility bills.
- **6.** Add cabinets & soundproofing to Reconciliation Room est. \$7.5K Privacy should be assumed in this room! As our population ages, speaking sometimes becomes louder and can be heard outside the current room. In addition, storage is badly needed for valuable items left in the room.
- **7.** New siding for the Rectory est. \$15K This is a normal maintenance item for an aging house. The current siding has deteriorated to the point that birds are nesting in the siding.
- **8.** <u>Video kiosks at both entrances to Commons to improve communications est. \$5K.</u> Kiosks would help communication with parishioners and keep everyone informed of upcoming events, special occasions, status of fundraisers, etc.
- **9.** Repair/resurface entire parking lot est. \$100K The parking lot needs a complete overlay after years of spot maintenance and badly deteriorating asphalt. It would send a message of pride to visitors to our parish as well as provide a much safer surface to walk upon.
- **10.** Partially Funded~2 classrooms completed Classroom Lighting update for efficiency est. \$24K Upgrading the classroom lighting would enhance the learning experience and reduce utility bills
