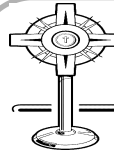

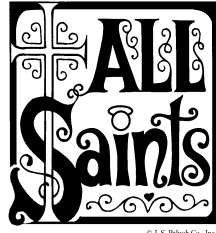
World Mission Sunday

NOTES

After the final Presidential debate, one thing is clear: those who know how to use words to their benefit can be very convincing. But is this ability necessarily a good thing? Does a person's ability to persuade make them virtuous?

Plato would call this ability "sophistry" when it falls into the hands of an unworthy individual. In Machiavelli's *The Prince* we see how a person's charm and soft words can lure many into following them, but we have to remember that actions speak louder than words.

As we prayerfully decide who we will vote for in November, let us keep in mind that, like the Pharisees who cleaned the outside, but not the inside, many can talk a good game, but ultimately, it is their actions that will tell where their heart truly lies.

God our Father, giver of life, we entrust the United States of America to Your loving care. You are the rock on which this nation was founded. You alone are the true source of our cherished rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Reclaim this land for Your glory and dwell among Your people. Faithful Citizenship

Excerpts from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' document:

"Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship"

Our redemption has a social dimension because "God, in Christ, redeems not only the individual person, but also . . . social relations."

To believe that the Holy Spirit is at work in everyone means realizing that he seeks to penetrate every human situation and all social bonds. . .

which invites us to receive God's love and to love him in return with... a primary and fundamental response: to desire, seek and protect the good of others.

(Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 178)

1. As a nation, we share many blessings and strengths, including a tradition of religious freedom and political participation. However, as a people, we face serious challenges that are both political and moral. This has always been so and as Catholics we are called to participate in public life in a manner consistent with the mission of our Lord, a mission that he has called us to share.

2. The political realities of our nation present us with opportunities and challenges. We are a nation founded on "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness," but the right to life itself is not fully protected, especially for unborn children, the terminally ill, and the elderly, the most vulnerable members of the American family. We are called to be peacemakers in a nation at war. We are a country pledged to pursue "liberty and justice for all," but we are too often divided across lines of race, ethnicity, and economic inequality. We are a nation of immigrants, struggling to address the challenges of many new immigrants in our midst. We are a society built on the strength of our families, called to defend marriage and offer moral and economic supports for family life. We are a powerful nation in a violent world, confronting terror and trying to build a safer, more just, more peaceful world. We are an affluent society where too many live in poverty and lack health care and other necessities of life.
