Happy November from 4! Grade Coming up, the upper grades at St. Felix have the opportunity to see the daughter of а Saint! Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was a well-known Italian doctor. With three medical degrees and three small children, she had a lot on her hands after World War II! She became pregnant a fourth time, but discovered she had uterine cancer. Although her peers recommended surgeries that could injure or kill the baby, she refused any sort of treatment for herself, telling them to choose the baby's life over her own. St. Gianna passed away a week after the birth of healthy little Gianna Emanuela, who is coming to La Crosse this week. Gianna Emanuela was able to bring up the gifts at Mass for her own mother's canonization in 2004! We are very excited to hear what she has to say!

In 4th grade, we also get to write letters to pen pals at St. Elizabeth's! Neither the students nor the recipients at the nursing home know who they are writing to because each has a code name. At the end of the year, we will finally get to meet the recipients of our letters! We are anxiously awaiting the next response from our buddies!

Grade 4 is a time for a lot of hands-on learning. We made flip books about the Midwest in Social Studies. We made a giant Venn diagram on the floor and have used shapes to represent landforms and the water cycle. There is a miniature cactus family that lives in our room, where the students explore plant growth, a magnifying glass, and predicting outcomes. We learned several ways to multiply large numbers and will be transitioning into division. The students also should be able to name their family members in Spanish and introduce them. We cannot wait to see what the second quarter holds for 4th grade!
