We will have an information meeting on Sunday May 17, 2015 at 11:15 am in the chapel after the mass. Plan for a 1 hour meeting. The meeting is for:

<u>Unbapitzed</u>: persons (age of discretion: 7+ years) who have never been baptized.

Baptized in Another Christian Church: Those who were baptized into an another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They are considered candidates.

<u>Baptized but uncatechized Catholic Adults</u>: persons who were baptized as infants and not given any or received some religious instruction in the Catholic faith and desire to receive First Communion and Confirmation. One needs to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor. Also information on annulments will be available.
