The salt content of the Dead Sea is about 25 percent, which is six times that of the ocean. There are no fish in it and freshwater fish carried into it by the Jordan River die instantly.



Answer for the Question of the Week A. is correct.

Not a particularly likable man Sixtus V (reigned 1585-1590) accomplished much during his short pontificate, which occurred during the Counter-Reformation. Under his direction many architectural projects were completed in Rome, including the dome of Saint Peter's and repairs to the Quirinal, Lateran, and Vatican Palaces. He limited the College of Cardinals to seventy members and increased the number of Vatican congregations in order to make the bureaucracy function more efficiently.

Tax Planning Qualified Charitable Distributions


