





BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

Today, June 24, is the birth of John the Baptist. Jesus called John the greatest of all those who had preceded him: "I tell you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John..." But John would have agreed completely with what Jesus added: "Yet the least in the kingdom of God is greater than he" (Luke 7:28).

John spent his time in the desert, an ascetic. He began to announce the coming of the kingdom and to call everyone to a fundamental reformation of life. His purpose was to prepare the way for Jesus. His baptism, he said, was for repentance. But One would come who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.

John is not worthy even to carry his sandals. His attitude toward Jesus was: "He must increase; I must decrease (John 3:30).





With All Your Heart



With All Your Heart offers a way to invite Catholics to fully live their faith as members of St. Vincent de Paul Parish. The aim is to strengthen parish life by increased involvement, generosity, and membership. The name is inspired by the Great Commandment taught by Jesus – Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. (Mk12:30). With All Your Heart consists of four 'Seasons of the Heart':

Heart to Pray (Nov., Dec., & Jan.) encourages each parishioner to go deeper in their prayer life, through which they can encounter the living Christ and experience His great mercy and love.

Heart to Serve (Feb., Mar., & Apr.) shows each parishioner how to put their whole heart into serving others, selflessly bringing the love of Christ to every person and into every situation.

Heart to Share (May, Jun., & Jul.) invites each parishioner to give freely in a spirit of faith of their time, talents, and treasures.

Heart to Witness (Aug., Sep., & Oct.) inspires parishioners to live the great Commission as disciples of Jesus – to welcome others and to share their joys with them in such a way that they desire to love God with all their heart.

These 'Seasons of the Heart' work together to bring about **Community** which acknowledges who we are as the Church – sisters and brothers

who must commit to grow in a loving, self-giving relationship with each other. We need each other, and only together, can we fulfill our purpose as the Body of Christ.

Below are some activities flowing from the Seasons of 'With All Your Heart' we have instituted over the past few years.

Healing Prayer – takes place after each Mass on the first weekend of the month. 
