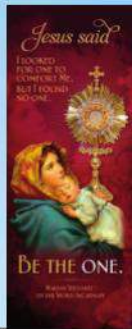

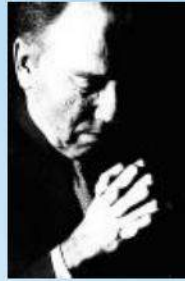

OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

Hermits lived on Mount Carmel near the Fountain of Elijah (northern Israel) in the twelfth century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. By the thirteenth century they became known as “Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.” They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary. In 1726 it became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary. 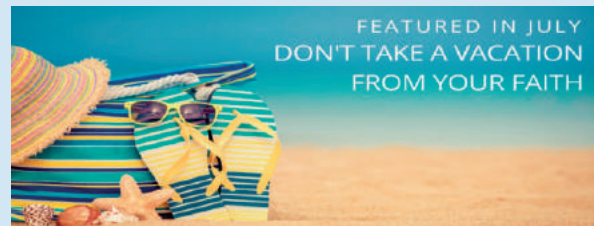

FIRST CATHEDRAL IN UNITED STATES

The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the first Catholic cathedral built in the United States., In 1789, Pope Pius VI asked Bishop John Carroll to build a cathedral in the area of Baltimore, Maryland. Bishop Carroll was the first Bishop named in the United States and his Diocese of Baltimore consisted of the original 13 colonies and a third of what is today the United States. Bishop Carroll commissioned architect Benjamin Latrobe to design the new cathedral. Unfortunately, Bishop Carroll died before its completion.

The serpent told Eve that if she eats of the tree in the middle of the garden her eyes “will be opened” and she “will be like God, knowing good and evil”. 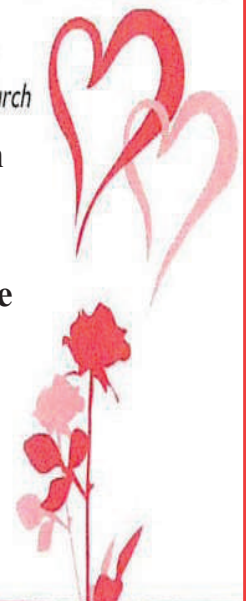

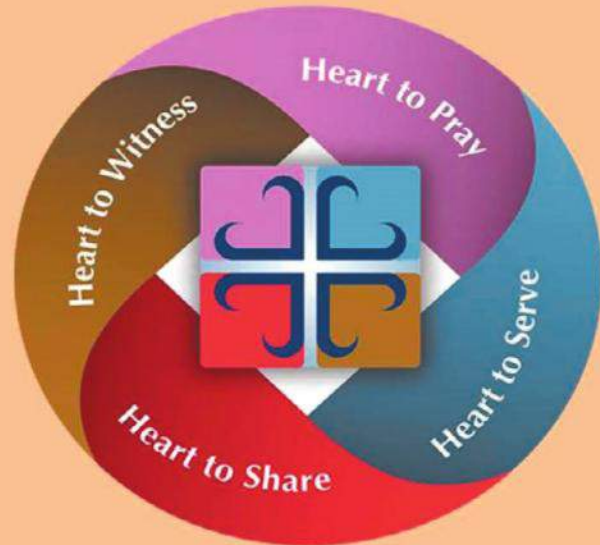

Heart to Witness (Aug., Sep., & Oct.) inspires parishioners to live the great Commission as disciples of Jesus – to welcome others and to share their joys with them in such a way that they desire to love God with all their heart.

These 'Seasons of the Heart' work together to bring about **Community** which acknowledges who we are as the Church – sisters and brothers

who must commit to grow in a loving, self-giving relationship with each other. We need each other, and only together, can we fulfill our purpose as the Body of Christ.

Below are some activities flowing from the Seasons of 'With All Your Heart' we have instituted over the past few years.

Healing Prayer – takes place after each Mass on the first weekend of the month. This is an opportunity for parishioners to come forward with their prayer intentions for physical, spiritual, or emotional healing for themselves or other family members and friends; for healing within family relationships; for healing in our society and world, and in our church.

Elder Kindness Day – takes place the last day of each month. This endeavor provides parishioners with the opportunity to reach out to the elders of our parish and community through a phone call, a visit, sending a card. The possibilities to reach out to the elderly are limitless.



MyParish App – helps keep the parishioners connected to the parish and parish activities through their Iphone or Android.

Within the App are the weekend homilies; the current bulletin; a directory of parish staff; a treasure chest of Catholic prayers; and much more. To download the app - Text APP to phone number 88202, visit myparishapp.com, access your app store, or scan the QR Code above.

"Seasonal" Calendars – are printed in the Church bulletin on a quarterly basis providing parishioners and visitors with suggestions on how to grow deeper in their prayer life; their service to others; their call to witness their Faith; and their call to respond in a spirit of generosity and stewardship.

Weekly Bulletin/Slides before Mass Reflections – give parishioners the ability to focus their reflections on an aspect of their call to Disciples of the Lord in their daily life.

Ministry Highlights

Choir

Music stirs the soul in such a deeply personal way that it becomes an essential element of good Liturgical worship. Here at St. Vincent de Paul, we have some of the best musicians and cantors you will find anywhere, and their different musical styles reach out and touch the heart and enliven the spirit. The combined musical styles of the choral groups and musicians encourage the congregation to sing and pray the Mass together. Making “joyful noises unto the Lord” is truly the vocation of the Music Ministry.

Purpose: To enhance liturgies with sacred music.

Responsibilities: Attend weekly scheduled choir practices, liturgies, and special occasions.

Helpful Attributes: Singing voice, enjoy singing.

Time Commitment: Weekly choir practices plus additional practices leading up to major holy days/church celebrations.

Training Required: None.

Fingerprinting/Safe Environment Training Required: Yes.



Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

When the needs of the Church require, and when sufficient ordinary Ministers (priests and deacons) of Holy Communion are not available, lay people designated by the Bishop may distribute Holy Communion at Mass and in other appropriate situations. Formal training, conducted by the Diocese, is required prior to serving in this ministry.



Purpose: Assist in distribution of Holy Communion during liturgies.

Responsibilities: Fulfill daily or monthly assignments.

Helpful Attributes: Strong commitment to Christ and the Church as evidenced by a life lived in conformity with all that the Church teaches.

Time Commitment: Must arrive 20-30 minutes before Mass.

Training Required: Provided by Diocese and Ministry.

Fingerprinting/Safe Environment Training Required: Yes.

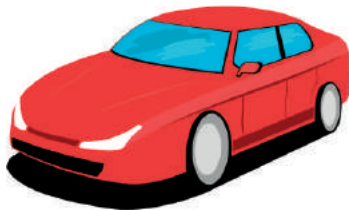
