



# Don't pass up unexpected or unscheduled moments of prayer.

Sometimes, without intending it, we naturally drift into prayer. It comes upon us at an unexpected moment. Don't put those times on "hold" as though you can retrieve them later. Go with it, however brief this time may be.

Some of the best experiences of prayer happen this way. Something doesn't have to "happen" every time we pray.

Don't look for immediate results. Prayer is "being with" God. The results are real but gradual. Every session of prayer is not meant to produce a new thought, a new resolution, a bottom line result.

That, by the way, is one of the things that can help make times of prayer enjoyable.




#### Hearing Loop Installed

We have a Hearing Loop in the main body of the church and the Narthex to assist those with hearing loss to hear more clearly during services. A Hearing Loop is an assistive listening system that transmits sound directly into one's hearing aids or cochlear implants rather than depending on sound coming from the loudspeakers. To receive the Loop signal, manually activate your T-coil or telephone setting on your hearing aid or cochlear


implant. If you don't know if you have a T-coil or whether yours is properly programmed, consult with your audiologist or hearing aid professional. If you don't wear hearing aids, please visit the Maintenance Team in the Narthex and ask to trial a Loop receiver to test the sound.

# WITH ALL YOUR HEART



With All Your Heart offers a way to invite Catholics to fully live their faith as members of St. Vincent de Paul Parish. The aim is to strengthen parish life by increased involvement, generosity, and membership. The name is inspired by the Great Commandment taught by Jesus – Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. (Mk 12:30). With All Your Heart consists of four 'Seasons of the Heart':

**Heart to Pray** (Nov – Dec – Jan) encourages each parishioner to go deeper in their prayer life, through which they can encounter the living Christ and experience His great mercy and love.

**Heart to Serve** (Feb – Mar - Apr) shows each parishioner how to put their whole heart into serving others, selflessly bringing the love of Christ to every person and into every situation.

**Heart to Share** (May – Jun - Jul) invites each parishioner to give freely in a spirit of faith of their time, talents, and treasures.

Heart to Witness (Aug – Sep - Oct) inspires parishioners to live the great Commission as disciples of Jesus – to welcome others and to share their joys with them in such a way that they desire to love God with all their heart.

These 'Seasons of the Heart' work together to bring about **Community** which acknowledges who we are as the Church – sisters and brothers who must com-

mit to grow in a loving, self-giving relationship with each other. We need each other, and only together, can we fulfill our purpose as the Body of Christ.

Below are some activities flowing from the Seasons of 'With All Your Heart' that we have instituted over the past few years.

**Healing Prayer** – takes place after each Mass on the first weekend of the month. This is an opportunity for parishioners to come forward with their prayer intentions for physical, spiritual, or emotional healing for themselves or other family members and friends; for healing within family relationships; for healing in our society and world, and in our church.

**Elder Kindness Day** – takes place the last day of each month. This endeavor provides parishioners with the opportunity to reach out to the elders of our parish and community through a phone call, a visit, sending a card. The possibilities to reach out to the elderly are limitless.

MyParish App – helps keep the parishioners connected to the parish and parish activities through their Iphone or Android. Within the App are the weekend homilies; the current bulletin; a directory of parish staff; a treasure chest of Catholic prayers; and much more. "Seasonal" Calendars – are printed in the Church bulletin on a quarterly basis providing parishioners and visitors with suggestions on how to grow deeper in their prayer life; their service to others; their call to witness their Faith; and their call to respond in a spirit of generosity and stewardship.

Weekly Bulletin/Slides before Mass Reflections – give parishioners the ability to focus their reflections on an aspect of their call to Disciples of the Lord in their daily life.

## MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

# **Sacristans**

Sacristans are those behind-the-scenes persons who make many of the needed preparations for our various liturgical celebrations. They prepare the sacred vessels and the bread and wine used at Mass and ensure everything necessary for each liturgy is in place. Through their efforts our liturgies are celebrated as intended.






