




ENDING THIS WEEK





Ministry of Consolation

The goal of the Ministry of Consolation is to ensure that no member of the parish grieves alone. The bereavement ministers are trained by the Diocese to assist pa-

rishioners as they grieve the death of a loved one. The ministers are trained to help with planning the Funeral Rite (Vigil, the Funeral Mass and Rite of Committal). This Ministry also provides all important follow-up care.

Responsibilities: Assist in planning funeral rites and in providing as-needed sup

port to grieving parishioners (e.g., food, transportation, follow-

up care).

Helpful Attributes: Compassion, sensitivity, strong human interaction skills.

Time Commitment: Several hours for each family. Depends on family needs and the

availability of the ministers.

Training Required: Provided by Diocese and Ministry. **Fingerprinting./Safe Environment Training Required:** Yes

Grief Support

Parishioners that have endured the loss of a loved one can seek refuge among others who

are experiencing similar loss. The process of bereavement is a difficult one, so it is the goal of this ministry to provide a haven to enable people in discussion about their grief. Allow people to understand there is no right way or wrong way to grieve, everyone must follow their own path.

Responsibilities: Facilitate discussion and use materials that follow weekly

topics. Attend meetings consistently.

Helpful Attributes: Be a good listener, can facilitate discussion. Must have ex

perienced personal loss.

Time Commitment: Varies.

Training Required: Must go through initial Ministry of Consolation training,

followed by week of Grief Support training.

Fingerprinting/Safe Environment Training Required: Yes, required only

ministry facilitators.




