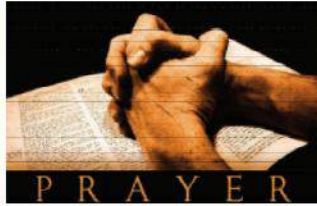

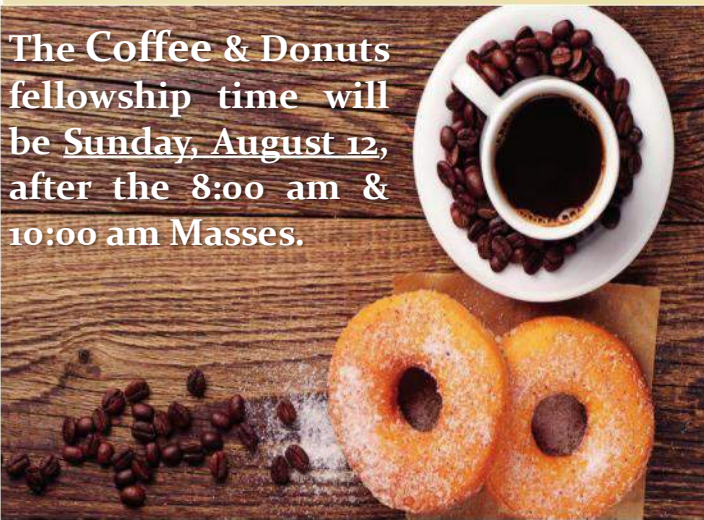

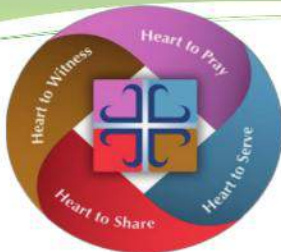

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the dogma that at the end of her life Mary was taken body and soul into heaven. Promulgated by Pius XII in the papal bull *Munificentissimus Deus* on November 1, 1950, and celebrated liturgically on August 15, this dogma states that "the Immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever Virgin when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven." In this definition no position is taken on the disputed question of whether Mary actually died nor are any historical details given. Rather, with the encouragement of 98 percent of the Catholic bishops who affirmed that the doctrine was both possible and opportune, the pope declared the faith of the Church that Mary in the fullness of her historical personality lives now in union with the risen Christ ©1995 The HarperCollins Encyclopedia of Catholicism HarperCollins Publisher, Inc.

What is the RCIA?



RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and it is the process through which persons - adults and children over seven years old - join or complete their initiation into the Catholic Church.

Is the RCIA for me or someone I know?

The RCIA is for three groups of people:

1. Those who are not baptized.
2. Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
3. Baptized Catholics who were never formed in the Catholic faith and have not completed their initiation; that is, who have received neither of the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

How does the RCIA work?

RCIA consists of four periods of formation which are marked by rituals that celebrate what has been completed and call a person into the next phase. There is no specific length of time for each period. The RCIA is a journey that "takes as long as it takes," according to each individual.

The four periods of formation are:

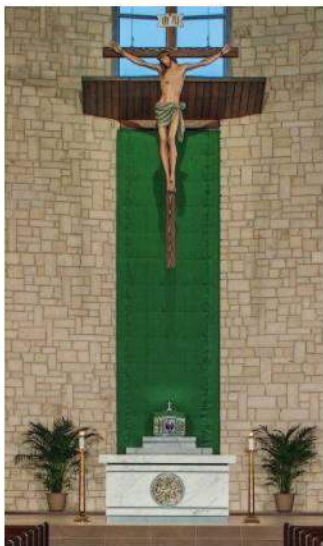
1. The Inquiry or Pre-catechumenate
2. The Catechumenate
3. The Lenten period of Purification and Enlightenment
4. Mystagogy or a time of deeper understanding of the "mysteries"

UNDERSTANDING MASS INTENTIONS



When a priest offers the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, he has three intentions. First is to offer the Mass reverently in accordance to Church Canon. Second, is to offer the Mass for the good and unity of the whole Church. Third, is to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died. This tradition of offering Masses for others originates in the very early church.

Since our Parish is constantly growing, there are a few policies that have been implemented so that everyone has an opportunity to offer a mass for their loved one:

1. A parish household may request only 3 Masses within a twelve-month period at St. Vincent de Paul. However, if you would like to have additional Masses said, you can request them to be said by Father Vitalis, who says Masses offsite at Coleman Prison. Although you cannot attend that Mass, the intention will still be said.
2. Only one Mass Intention for each Mass offered at St. Vincent de Paul will be published in the Parish bulletin. Please note: the Pastor is obligated by Canon Law to see that a Mass is offered for "Parishioners Intentions" every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

Canon Law also states that a parish cannot accept a request for a Mass which cannot be offered within a twelve-month period from when it was requested. For example, a Mass requested in March of 2018 must be said by February 28th, 2019. One could not request a Mass in March 2018 and request that it be said in August of 2019. Another example, on the first business day of the month, March 1st, 2018, the calendar is opened for February 2019.

We need to be mindful that the graces of the Mass are not limited to or are only for one published intention. That is why the Introductory Rites conclude with an opening prayer, called the Collect. The presider invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence, proclaims the prayer of the day. The Collect gathers the prayers (intentions) of all into one and disposes all to hear the Word of God in the context of the celebration.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ANOINTING OF THE SICK AND 'LAST RITES?'

Most of us usually think of asking for the Sacrament of Anointing, for ourselves or our loved ones, only when one is nearing death through sickness or old age. However, in this case, we would be missing out on the opportunity for God to heal and help us at times when we might need Him the most.

It is during the difficult times of our life, for example, when we are having surgery, dealing with a physical, mental, emotional, or even spiritual affliction that we need the gifts of strength, faith, peace, and courage. It is during these times that we should seek to receive this God-given sacrament. **If you are unsure or in doubt, call the parish office.**

When the Anointing of the Sick is administered to a person who is likely dying the **Apostolic Blessing** and **Viaticum**, their last reception of Holy Communion which is their food for the journey from this life to eternity, is given along with the anointing and that is considered **last rites**. This is most likely the last time the person will receive Holy Communion. It is important that this Sacrament is celebrated while the person is still conscious and coherent.

Another important thing to keep in mind is that Anointing of the Sick can only be administered to the living. This sacrament cannot be administered to one who has already passed. It is a Sacrament and sacraments are celebrated and administered only with and to the living.



MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS



Ministry to the Sick is the compassionate care brought to people who are hospitalized, confined to nursing homes, hospices, or are too incapacitated to leave their homes. Min-

sters bring the Eucharist, share their time, listen to, and pray along with the infirmed and their family and caregivers. Those who participate in this practice of charity attest to Jesus' healing presence in our community.

- Purpose:** To take the Eucharist to parishioners who are homebound, hospitalized, or confined to nursing homes or hospice facilities.
- Responsibilities -** Drive to the parishioner's location, administer Holy Communion. Visit, listen to and pray with the infirmed, the family and caregivers that may be present.
- Helpful Attributes-** Compassion for the sick and dying.
- Time Commitment -** Varies.
- Training Required -** Provided by Ministry.
- Fingerprinting/Safe Environment Training Required -** Yes
- Driver's License/Insurance Verification -** Yes

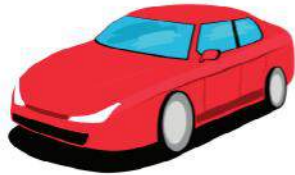
