EPISTLES AND GOSPELS

As far as is known, Jesus did not write a word during his lifetime, nor did he tell any of his disciples to write. The oldest preserved Christian writings is Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians, dated about 20 years after the Resurrection –50 A.D. (The earliest Gospel is Mark's dated about 70 A.D.)

Since the first generation of Christians expected the early return of Christ, they felt no need to write an enduring record of what he did and said. All of the earliest writings came from Paul who, because he traveled from place to place, needed to have some way of communicating with the churches he founded. So, he wrote letters. He didn't intend these to be enduring treatises (he too expected the early return of Christ). Because in some of his letters, Paul refers to other letters that no longer exist, we know that some were lost.

By the late 6o's or early 70's , most of those who had known Jesus or seen the risen Jesus, had died. Christians realized that the return of Christ was not as imminent as they thought, and more lasting documents were needed to preserve his memory That is how the Gospels came to be.

What is the RCIA?



In last weeks' bulletin we noted that the RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and it is the process through which persons - adults and children over seven years old - join or complete their initiation into the Catholic Church.

This week we reflect on the first two stages or formation periods of the RCIA.

Period of Inquiry or Pre-catechumenate

The first stage is called the period of inquiry (or the precatechumenate). This is when the individual first expresses an interest in becoming a Christian or a Catholic. With the help of the parish community, the individual explores his or her relationship with Christ and how that relationship might be enriched and deepened by joining the Catholic community.

Catechumenate

The second stage is called the catechumenate. This is a time for the catechumen or candidate to learn how to live as a Catholic Christian through their faith journey and the support of their parish community. This period ends when the catechumens and candidates express their desire to receive the sacraments of initiation and the parish community acknowledges their readiness.

BEWARE OF SCAMMERS!

It has come to our attention that there have been predatory emails being sent out to various individuals from an unknown source posing as clergy. Please be aware, the clergy will <u>never</u> directly reach out to any individual requesting favors. All requests for monetary donations will be made in church and through our weekly collections. Please disregard any unexpected requests that come through email.

Never give out your personal information or credit card information to an unknown source.

Do not click on links from unknown email addresses — the links can be attached to nefarious sources that can infect your computer with malware and viruses.

My Parish App keeps you in the loop with all of our parish happenings! We send out messages to our parishioners to remind them about upcoming holy days, special events or if there are any unexpected closures! Download the app from the Apple store or from the Googleplay store!

10 Things You Can Do to Avoid Fraud

1. Spot imposters. Scammers often pretend to be someone you trust, like a government official, a family member, a charity, or a company you do business with. Don't send money or give out personal information in response to an unexpected request — whether it comes as a text, a phone call, or an email.

2. Do online searches. Type a company or product name into your favorite search engine with words like "review," "complaint" or "scam." Or search for a phrase that describes your situation, like "IRS call." You can even search for phone numbers to see if other people have reported them as scams.

3. Don't believe your caller ID. Technology makes it easy for scammers to fake caller ID information, so the name and number you see aren't always real. If someone calls asking for money or personal information, hang up. If you think the caller might be telling the truth, call back to a number you know is genuine.

4. Don't pay upfront for a promise. Someone might ask you to pay in advance for things like debt relief, credit and loan offers, mortgage assistance, or a job. They might even say you've won a prize, but first you have to pay taxes or fees. If you do, they will probably take the money and disappear.

5. Consider how you pay. Credit cards have significant fraud protection built in, but some payment methods don't. Wiring money through services like Western Union or MoneyGram is **risky** because it's nearly impossible to get your money back. That's also true for reloadable cards like Money-Pak, Reloadit or Vanilla. Government offices and honest companies won't require you to use these payment methods.

6. Talk to someone. Before you give up your money or personal information, talk to someone you trust. Con artists want you to make decisions in a hurry. They might even threaten you. Slow down, check out the story, do an online search, consult an expert — or just tell a friend.

7. Hang up on robocalls. If you answer the phone and hear a recorded sales pitch, hang up and report it to the FTC. These calls are illegal, and often the products are bogus. Don't press 1 to speak to a person or to be taken off the list. That could lead to more calls.

8. Be skeptical about free trial offers. Some companies use free trials to sign you up for products and bill you every month until you cancel. Before you agree to a free trial, research the company and read the cancellation policy. And always review your monthly statements for charges you don't recognize.

9. Don't deposit a check and wire money back. By law, banks must make funds from deposited checks available within days, but uncovering a fake check can take weeks. If a check you deposit turns out to be a fake, you're responsible for repaying the bank.

10. Sign up for free scam alerts from the FTC at ftc.gov/scams. Get the latest tips and advice about scams sent right to your inbox.
