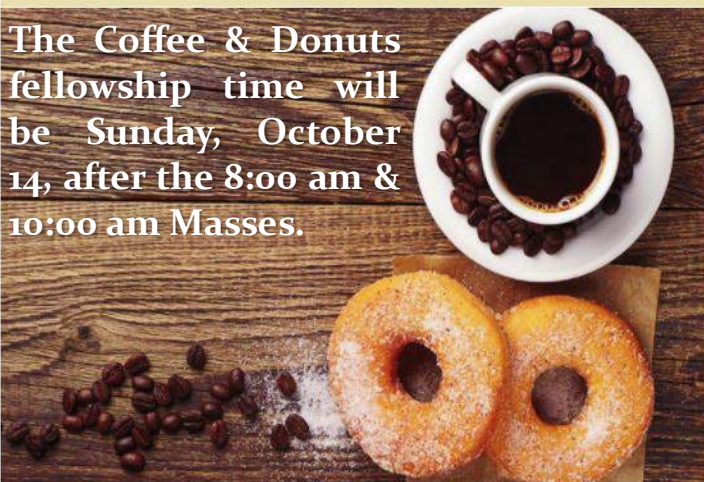

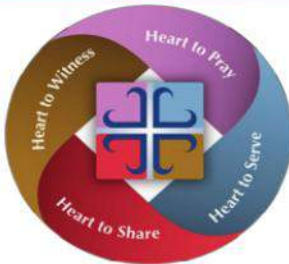

Giuseppe Moscati, "The Holy Physician of Naples" was a layman and medical doctor who came from an aristocratic Italian family. He devoted his medical career to serving the poor. He was also a medical school professor and a pioneer in the field of biochemistry whose research led to the discovery of insulin as a cure for diabetes.

Giuseppe Moscati died in 1927 at 46 years of age, was beatified in 1975, and declared a saint by Pope John Paul II in 1987.

MATTHEW: APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST

Matthew was a Jew who worked for the occupying Roman forces, collecting taxes from other Jews. The Romans were not scrupulous about what the "tax farmers" got for themselves. Hence the latter, known as "publicans," were generally hated as traitors by their fellow Jews. The Pharisees lumped them with "sinners" (Matthew 9:11-13). So it was shocking to them to hear Jesus call such a man to be one of his intimate followers. Matthew got Jesus in further trouble by having a sort of going away party at his house. His Gospel tells us that "many" tax collectors and "those known as sinners" came to dinner.

What business did the supposedly great teacher have associating with such immoral people? The Pharisees were even more shocked by Jesus's answer, "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous but sinners" (Matthew 9:12b-13).

C. is correct. We can know some things about God through reason alone—for example, that he exists, created us, and rules the world. Other things we know about God only through revelation from God—for example, the Trinity (God's own inner life), the Hypostatic Union, and the Incarnation. There is far more that we don't know about God and, given our creaturely limitations, can't know.

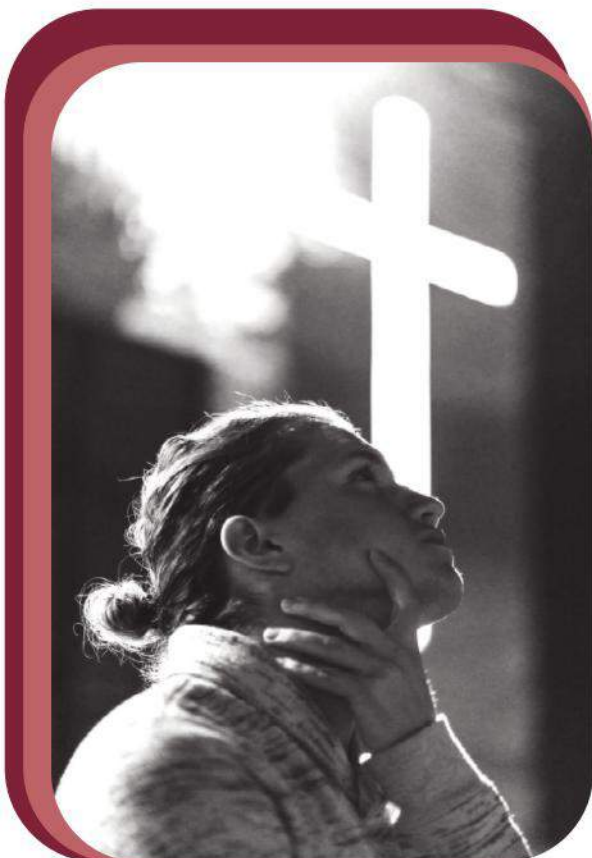
