

Giuseppe Moscati, "The Holy Physician of Naples" was a layman and medical doctor who came from an aristocratic Italian fami-

ly. He devoted his medical career to serving the poor. He was also a medical school professor and a pioneer in the field of biochemistry whose research led to the discovery of insulin as a cure for diabetes.

Giuseppe Moscati died in 1927 at 46 years of age, was beatified in 1975, and declared a saint by Pope John Paul II in 1987.

Helpful Attributes:

A SCC member is an individual who is willing to share his/her faith journey with others. Come as you are, bringing your successes, as well as your failures.

The members are active listeners who accept others' differences. They may disagree at times, but they look for common ground per the values we share as Christians. CONFIDENTIALITY is of the utmost importance.

Time Commitment:

Most communities meet twice a month for about 2 hours. Each group will decide what days and times will work best for the majority. Communities are very flexible, doing their best to meet everyone's needs.

Training Required:

None. Also, study/question materials are all provided.
