





FRANCIS OF ASSISI October 4



Francis of Assisi was poor, only so that he might be Christ-like. He recognized creation as another manifestation of the beauty of God. In 1979 he was named patron of ecology. Francis did great penance (apologizing to "Brother Body" later in life) that he might be totally disciplined for the will of God. His

poverty had a sister, humility, by which he meant total dependence on the good God. But all this was, as it were, preliminary to the heart of his spirituality; living the Gospel life, summed up in the charity of Jesus and perfectly expressed in the Eucharist.




