#### **SIMBÁNG GABI**

The Simbáng Gabi originated in the early days of Spanish rule over the Philippines as a practical compromise for farmers, who began work before sunrise to avoid the noonday heat out in the fields. Priests began to say Mass in the early mornings instead of the evening novenas more common in the rest of the Hispanic world. This cherished Christmas custom eventually became a distinct feature of Philippine culture and became of symbol of sharing.

Simbáng Gabi, also known by it's popular Spanish name as Misa de Gallo, or "mass of the rooster" is a series of nine dawn Masses. The Mass starts as early as 4:00 a m. It begins on December 16 and end on the midnight of December 24, which is the midnight Mass.

In the olden days, the church bells would start ringing as early as 3:00 am waking people up so they can get ready for the 4:00 am dawn Mass. The Roman Catholic churches across the nation start to open their doors shortly before the break of dawn to welcome the faithful for the Simbáng Gabi Mass.

Today, the tradition continues whether you live in the city or in the province, although it is celebrated in new ways.

St. Vincent de Paul will be celebrating Simbáng Gabi on Thursday, December 20, at 6:00 pm. Everyone is welcome to come celebrate!
