



After announcing to Mary that she would be the mother of God, the Angel Gabriel went on to foretell that her cousin, Elizabeth, even though she was old, would give birth to a son. Mary set out, at once, to visit Elizabeth and congratulate her on the coming birth of her son. The moment Elizabeth saw Mary approach-

ing her house she ran out to meet her and, having learned from the Holy Spirit Mary's new dignity, she cried out, "Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb. And how have I deserved that the mother of my Lord should come to me?"

Replying to these inspired words of Elizabeth, Mary joyously cried out, "My soul doth magnify the Lord. And my spirit hath rejoiced in God, my Savior. Because He hath regarded the humility of His handmaid; for, behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. 

more clearly during services. A Hearing Loop is an assistive listening system that transmits sound directly into one's hearing aids or cochlear implants rather than depending on sound coming from the loudspeakers. To receive the Loop signal, manually activate your T-coil or telephone setting on your hearing aid or cochlear implant. If you don't know if you have a T-coil or whether yours is properly programmed, consult with

your audiologist or hearing aid professional. If you don't wear hearing aids, please visit the Maintenance Team in the Narthex and ask to try a Loop receiver to test the sound






Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States for remembering the people who died while serving in the country's armed forces. The holiday, which is currently observed every year on the last Monday of May, originated as **Decoration** Day after the American Civil War in 1868, when the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans founded in Decatur, Illinois, established it as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the Union war dead with flowers. By the 20th century, competing Union and Confederate holiday traditions, celebrated on different days, had merged, and Memorial Day eventually extended to honor all Americans who died while in the military service. It marks the start of the unofficial summer vacation season, while Labor Day marks its end. Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, particularly to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers

place an American flag on each grave in national cemeteries.

Annual Decoration Days for particular cemeteries are held on a Sunday in late spring or early summer in some rural areas of the American South, notably in the mountain areas. In cases involving a family graveyard where remote ancestors as well as those who were deceased more recently are buried, this may take on the character of an extended family reunion to which some peo-


