National Catholic Schools Week is an annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. Catholic schools all across America typically celebrate Catholic Schools Week with special Masses, Open Houses and other fun activities for students, families, parishioners and the community at large. This celebration week was established in 1974 to recognize Catholic education as a great gift to the Church and the nation.

"Historically, Catholic schools are known for their high level of academic achievement, moral values, and high graduation rates," said Karen Ristau of the National Catholic Educational Association. "What may not be as widely recognized are the outstanding successes recorded by students of low-income families and students from inner cities. That's certainly a plus for many portions of the American population."

The executive director of the Secretariat of Catholic Education at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has also noted that "nearly 30 percent of the nation's 2.1 million Catholic school students come from minority populations. Enrollment of students who are not Catholic has increased to over 14 percent, an indication that many diverse families seek the benefits of a quality education with moral underpinnings." The 7,094 Catholic elementary and secondary schools make up over 44 percent of all private schools in the United States.



As January transitions into February, here are two more health observances, both related to vision. I've included St. Angela de Merici in this column; read on and see why . . .

Glaucoma is a group of diseases where the fluid within the eye drains too slowly, and, as the fluid builds up, the pressure inside the eye rises to a level that can cause damage. This can affect peripheral (or side) vision; without treatment, vision can be lost. Once vision is lost from glaucoma, it can't be restored. Most routine eye exams include a test for glaucoma. Treatment includes prescription eye drops. Anyone can get glaucoma, but those at higher risk include African Americans over age 40, everyone over age 60, especially Hispanics/Latinos, people with a family history of the disease. <u>https://nei.nih.gov/nehep/gam/</u>

Low vision: When vision can't be improved with glasses, contact lenses or surgery, it is referred to as low vision. This makes day to day things like cooking and watching TV hard to do. Low vision is usually caused by eye diseases or other health conditions such as age-related macular degeneration, cataract, diabetes and glaucoma; diseases for which older adults are at higher risk. Eye injuries and birth defects are other causes. Whatever the cause, lost vision often can't be restored, but can be managed with proper treatment and vision rehabilitation. Signs of low vision could include difficulty—even when wearing glasses or contact lenses with recognizing faces, getting around the neighborhood, sewing or fixing things around the house, or selecting and matching the color of clothes. The sooner vision loss or eye disease is detected and treated, the greater the chances of keeping the remaining vision. https://nei.nih.gov/nehep/lvam

Wear sunglasses when appropriate: not only will you look cool, you'll protect your eyes.

St Angela de Merici is the patron saint of sickness, disabled and physically challenged people, and those grieving the loss of parents. In Crete, while on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, she was struck blind. Her friends wanted to return home, but she insisted on going on, visiting the shrines with as much devotion and enthusiasm as if she could see. On the way home, while praying before a crucifix, she regained her sight at the same place where it had been lost. She also founded the Ursilines on Nov. 25, 1535, under the protection of St Ursala.
