

Her life expectancy at that time was just ten years, but Wineland recently died at the age of 21. During those 'extra' years of her life, she created the Claire's Place Foundation and taught the world that being sick does not mean that your life can't be amazing. After spending more than a quarter of her life in the hospital and enduring 35 surgeries, she said, 'I've had a very abnormal life and I've thoroughly enjoyed it. There's so much more to life than just being healthy. There's so much more than just being normal.' As a child, she didn't have any role models who were sick like she was. So she became one, traveling, speaking, and running a non-profit. Wineland taught us that a life of health challenges is not something to be afraid of. It's like anyone else's, with the same opportunities for the wonderful, the amazing, and the normal to occur. Even more, she said that the 'people who suffer most in life actually have the most to give."


