Letter from Father Dan Thelen.

It is with great joy that I will be able to serve here as an Associate Pastor. Just a week and a half ago I was ordained to the priesthood with four other young men. Thus the holy oils from our consecration will still be wet when I begin ministry here in Wausau. Nevertheless, I am eager and excited to begin.

I grew up on a dairy farm in the small town of Clear Lake, Wisconsin. After high school I spent four years at UW-River Falls and obtained a degree in horticulture. Following my graduation I worked for about 5 years in the field before joining seminary. Since that time six years of formation and study in theology and philosophy have passed and now I am eager to begin active ministry.

I look forward to meeting all of you. I have always enjoyed community life and hope that I can help foster this already strong virtue in your parish. Two years ago I spent a summer at St Mary's in Marathon City. During that summer I got to know and love the Wausau area. So I feel in a sense like I am coming back home!

I look forward to learning from you as I begin my priestly ministry. There is much that the books in my theology classes could never teach. Please pray for me and know that I am praying for you!

Our Church or My Church

Let us ponder a few questions: Is this your Church, or is this our Church? Does the Church belong to you, or do you belong to the Church? Are the prayers we pray during Mass your prayers, or are they our prayers? Is religion all about me, or is it all about us?

The answers to these questions are both. Our religious lives are both individual and communal at the same time. There are voices in the world that tell us that we can accomplish everything on our own. Shelves are filled with "self-help" books replacing "God-help" books.

The truth is that God has sent His Son to save us, not to show us how we can save ourselves. Our religion and our faith are not meant to be isolated and confined to ourselves. My faith and your faith are shaped and formed and strengthened by the faith of others. And my faith and your faith are meant to shape and form and strengthen the faith of others. Our faith comes to us through a community of Catholic believers who strive to practice the faith.

The practice of the Catholic Faith is a problem for many, because it calls us to a faith that is both individual and communal. A faith that is responsible for ourselves and for others. When we practice our Catholic Faith, it helps to strengthen others by our good example. And the good example of others is meant to strengthen us. On the other hand, when we fail to practice our Catholic Faith, our bad example weakens the faith of others. And sadly, the bad example of others can discourage us and weaken us in the practice of our faith.

When you make a commitment to belong to the Church and to a parish, you are making a commitment not only to yourself, but to others as well, who may be quite different from you. A parish community is sort of like Heinz 57 sauce, we are all unique, but are called to be one in the practice of our Catholic Faith.

Those who claim to follow Christ, and yet refuse to worship with those of the same faith, are living in spiritual isolation. Sure there are sinners in the Church, and people we may not like, yet to reject communal worship, is to reject your responsibility to strengthen fellow Catholics in the practice of their faith.

Our Lord selected twelve individuals, and He lived with them and He taught them, not as individuals, but as a group. He formed them into a community to be united as one in His Church. And in the Gospel today, our Lord sent His disciples out into the world two by two, not individually.

The Christian religion cannot be a "me and Jesus" religion, it is a "we and Jesus" religion. The Catholic Church is a family, not a club. That's why it is important for us all to build up and strengthen our family of faith by our good example. There are builders and there are bashers, those who build up and those who tear down. It's very easy to be a basher, but to be a builder takes faith, charity, patience, hope, strength and courage.

The Church needs you! I need you! Christ needs you! We need each other! Christ is the life-giving Vine. We are called to be the living branches, united together in Christ. May we not be isolated in the practice of our faith, nor a basher. But instead, may we be a builder, who is active in our community of Faith!

Today, Archbishop Joseph Kurtz, president of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, released the following statement about the Supreme Court’s 5-4 ruling legalizing same-sex marriage:

Regardless of what a narrow majority of the Supreme Court may declare at this moment in history, the nature of the human person and marriage remains unchanged and unchangeable. Just as *Roe v. Wade* did not settle the question of abortion over forty years ago, *Obergefell v. Hodges* does not settle the question of marriage today. Neither decision is rooted in the truth, and as a result, both will eventually fail. Today the Court is wrong again. It is profoundly immoral and unjust for the government to declare that two people of the same sex can constitute a marriage.

The unique meaning of marriage as the union of one man and one woman is inscribed in our bodies as male and female. The protection of this meaning is a critical dimension of the “integral ecology” that Pope Francis has called us to promote. Mandating marriage redefinition across the country is a tragic error that harms the common good and most vulnerable among us, especially children. The law has a duty to support every child’s basic right to be raised, where possible, by his or her married mother and father in a stable home.

Jesus Christ, with great love, taught unambiguously that from the beginning marriage is the lifelong union of one man and one woman. As Catholic bishops, we follow our Lord and will continue to teach and to act according to this truth.

I encourage Catholics to move forward with faith, hope, and love: faith in the unchanging truth about marriage, rooted in the immutable nature of the human person and confirmed by divine revelation; hope that these truths will once again prevail in our society, not only by their logic, but by their great beauty and manifest service to the common good; and love for all our neighbors, even those who hate us or would punish us for our faith and moral convictions.

Lastly, I call upon all people of good will to join us in proclaiming the goodness, truth, and beauty of marriage as rightly understood for millennia, and I ask all in positions of power and authority to respect the God-given freedom to seek, live by, and bear witness to the truth.

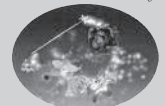
