I pray these lines find all doing well. Although the date reads that we are into fall you could never tell by the weather, its been pretty oppressive!

This week's Gospel gives us two different subjects on which to focus. Being self centered or being child – like. The two are significantly different. Notice I am saying child-like not childish, big difference. Actually being childish usually implies self centeredness.

We have a reason to thank God for the "human-ness" of the disciples because think we can learn what "not to do" from them. Think about it, their teacher and Lord just tells them He is going to be killed and what are they talking about—who amongst them is the greatest. How self –absorbed and childish can you get?

To be child-like is to maintain a sense of wonder, to see the world with an optimism that begins always on a positive note. A spiritual directee of mine from the distant past made Eeyore from Winnie the Pooh look like "Little Mary Sunshine" next to him, everything was so negative. In fact at one point he coined a phrase wrong and he said "you know what they always say, "Hope fades eternal" to which I stared laughing as I corrected him. The phrase is "Hope springs eternal". He then started laughing too, realizing he did have quite the negative outlook on life.

Our God is totally Amazing!!! God is in charge of us "If we let Him be, but, only if we let Him." I'll let you in on a little secret—If you think hope does fade eternal for your life then YOU are in charge. If hope springs eternal—you are in the process of giving it all to GOD!
