Health Ministry:

Nose Blowing 101

The cold and flu season still lingers as allergy season approaches. Both are often accompanied with a stuffy, runny nose. Mucus has an important purpose, for it contains antibodies and enzymes which trap and kill invaders like bacteria, viruses and dust before they get into the body. Mucus production goes into overdrive with a cold or allergy. People want the excess gone the quickest way...BLOW. This may feel good, but may actually worsen the condition if done unsafely by generating too much pressure which forces some of the mucus into the sinuses.



Best nose blowing technique:

- *Open your mouth slightly. This prevents undo pressure to eardrums.
- *Close one nostril and blow *gently*.
- *Repeat on the other side.
- Double nostril blowing generates enormous pressure forcing mucus into sinuses.*
- *Dispose of used tissue. Wash hands if possible.

Best nose blowing manners:

- *At the dining table, you can wipe your nose but never blow. Come prepared with tissues and don't use the napkin.
- *Leave an occupied area if you feel the blow will be loud or prolonged.

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



First Reading - Genesis 12:1-4

The first 11 chapters of Genesis have very little historical foundation but they teach religious truths in parable form. Today we begin the 12th chapter which contains stories with identifiable historical roots. The first of these is the call of Abraham, whose original name was "Abram"

Second Reading - 2 Timothy 1:8-10

The second letter to Timothy, although probably written some 30 years after Paul's death, was written in his name. This was an acceptable practice at that time. It was not a forgery, but an acknowledged way of continuing someone's spirit and authority. In this passage, the author encourages the readers in the face of trials.

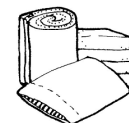

A SVDP Outreach Profile

Myron, a 65-year-old veteran, has recently been living at Hope House homeless shelter. While there, he met with the Butler County Veteran's Association and they were able to find an apartment for him. He suffers from PTSD and his new place is quiet and in a low crime area. He is so pleased to be away from the chaos of homelessness. He asked our SVDP Outreach for help with furnishing his apartment and we were glad to do so. With the vouchers we provided to the Mason Thrift Shop, he was able to get kitchen chairs and end tables for his living room. Our plan is to finish him up with some donated items, which will leave him just needing a bed. We will purchase the bed later this month at the Dayton SVDP Thrift Shop. He is ok just sleeping on his couch until we can make a delivery.



This is just a snapshot of the people we see every day who need help. We are happy to join with other groups, like the BCVA to provide that help, **but it wouldn't be possible without YOUR financial help.** With that in mind, we will be trying something new for our Fifth Sunday collections. In addition to your familiar SVDP volunteer at the door after Mass, there will be an envelope in your packet which we hope will cause you to think of the ministries you support through SVDP: Pantry, Outreach, Prison Ministry, Help Line, Backpack and Senior Citizen food deliveries. We thank you for your help and want you to know we are good stewards of your generosity. Jesus' example of caring for the poor is alive and well at Holy Family Parish.

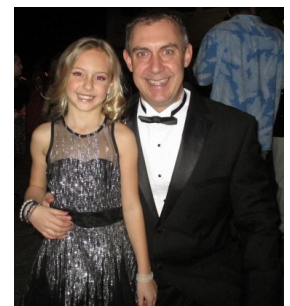
