Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



First Reading - Isaiah 50:4-7

Chapters 40-55 of the Book of Isaiah contain the message of a prophet who spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon. Several times the prophet speaks abut a servant who will one day deliver God's people. Because the servant is portrayed as suffering, Christians have traditionally identified Jesus with this suffering servant.

Second Reading - Philippians 2:6-11

In the years following Christ's death and resurrection, Christians began to develop the prayers and hymns that would become part of their rituals. In today's passage from the letter to the Philippians, Paul appears to be quoting an early Christian hymn celebrating the dying and rising of Christ.

A husband, wife and their three children just moved into a house with nothing but beds for the two children and a pack-n-play for the 10 month old baby. He works full-time third shift and his wife struggles with medical issues. His aunt was able to get them a dresser but they needed everything else.



- 1. (c) Holy Week is the last week of Lent, just before Easter, and focuses on Jesus' final days on earth before his Resurrection, celebrated on Easter Sunday. It is a time of preparation for Easter in which worshippers take an active part in the Gospel story through symbolic rituals and the hearing of pertinent scriptures.
- 2. (d) Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday and ends on Holy Saturday, just before Easter. It does not include Easter Sunday, which is the first day of a new church season - Easter Season - the fifty days from Easter to Pentecost.
- 3. (d) A typical Palm Sunday will usually include a reading of the Gospel account of how Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to shouts of hosanna and worshippers will often be given palm leaves to wave. Some weave these palm leaves into the shape of the cross.
- 4. (b) Holy Thursday commemorates Christ's final Passover meal with his disciples, when he instituted the practice of the Eucharist. Some churches hold services that include foot washing, in remembrance of how Jesus washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper. Some churches also hold a Passover meal.
- 5. (a) Good Friday commemorates Christ's crucifixion and is generally observed in a somber manner. It is typically a day of fasting and Mass is never celebrated on Good Friday except in the special exemption of the Vatican or a local bishop. Holy Family Parish offers two Communion Services on Good Friday.
- 6. (a) The altar is typically stripped after the service on Holy Thursday and remains so until the Easter Vigil.
