

SVDP Outreach Ministry - A Personal Story

The family that SVDP is highlighting for the month of April came from Tennessee looking for work



and to be near family. The group included a brother and sister, their spouses plus two children each and a baby on the way. They arrived here with only their trucks and some clothing. The parents that live here in town aren't in a position to help them financially. After a couple of weeks of looking for a house, they found a two story to rent that would accommodate all eight of them plus the baby to come. The downside of the house was its really rough condition – full of trash from the previous renter from top to bottom. Broken windows, poor plumbing, no stove or refrigerator, broken gutters and substandard floor and walls rounded out the list of problems. The upside for them was that the landlord would rent to them for \$650 instead of \$700 if they were willing to clean. They agreed to the deal and spent several days working on the house. Two of the four found jobs, one at minimum wage and the other for tips only. SVDP stepped in to help with basic needs. Living room furniture and beds for the children were provided, as well as a stove which was donated by a Holy Family parishioner. Referrals were made to Community Pregnancy Center for baby furniture and to the Clothing Depot for clothes for the entire family. The family was very appreciative of all our parish did for them and stated they didn't know how they would have managed without our help. They felt we made it possible for a new start in life. Thank you!
