- 1. Don't skip breakfast; Watch sugar content.

- 5. Read every day. Begin reading to kids as early as 6 months of age.

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Acts 2:1-11



Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebration. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13 Paul's first letter to the Corinthians responds to a letter they wrote to him. They had asked him how to deal with the diversity of gifts in the community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitable arose. In today's passage, he uses a comparison that we will recognize immediately.






