### **Health Ministry:**

Things Not to Say to Your Child Sometimes we all say the wrong things which often



have been passed down through generations. Let's try to ease these common, often hurtful phrases from our vocabulary.

"Leave me alone." Said often, a child may internalize it and be less likely to tell you things when they are older. "You're so ... " Do not label. Negative labels can become a self-fulfilling prophesy. "Why Can't You Be More Like ... " Do not compare, for it almost always backfires. "Stop it or I'll..." "Wait til your dad gets home!" Multiple threats are rarely effective. Sooner or later you have to make good on the threat. "Great job." When praise is vague and used too often it becomes meaningless and kids tune out. Praise only accomplishments that require real effort. Don't say "Yes" all the time. Children need limits. Love is not giving into your child's every desire. "Don't cry." "Don't be sad." "Don't be scared." May send the message to children that their emotions aren't valid. Help them name their feelings. The list goes on: "You're stupid." "You're fat." "You'll never amount to anything." "I can't forgive you." "I'm ashamed of you." "I'm disappointed in you."

Misty and Daniel are a young couple who are parents to four children and have recently moved into their first "real home" in a large apartment complex in Middletown. When I first met Daniel at the initial home visit, Misty was with their 6-year-old son at Children's Hospital in West Chester. He had had a seizure which was a new condition for their son and since they have only one car, Daniel was unable to work that day and needed to care for their infant son. Misty is the usual caregiver, although it was apparent Daniel knew what he was doing. Daniel works every day the weather permits cutting grass and doing light landscaping. His employer is an older gentleman and he and Daniel are the only employees of the older gentleman's small business. On days when Daniel is able to work, they get all of the children ready, drop Daniel at his

first appointed cutting job, and then Misty takes the older children to school. Everything in their home had been given to them by friends or acquaintances. The home was very neat, clean, and uncluttered. SVDP was able to provide a single and a double donated beds with all the bedding plus kitchen items. Misty's specific request was for a cookie sheet so she could bake cookies for her children. These two adults have seen hard times, but are thankful they finally have a home for their family. And although they know this is not their forever home, each of them referenced gratitude to God for the blessings they have and for opportunities they have been given. It is apparent to me that they each have the hope, desire, and ability to go forward and create the future they see and want for their children and themselves.

### Flag Day - Wednesday, June 14<sup>th</sup>

The Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus is the Patriotic degree and we are proud of our devotion to God and country, and believe in standing up for both. Whether it's in public or private, the Knights remind the world that Catholics support their nation and its flag. We Americans love our flag!

The United States of America is the only country that pledges its allegiance to its flag and not a leader or the country itself. Likewise, our National Anthem is about the flag that represents our great country and each of us.

Flag Day is celebrated on June 14<sup>th</sup>. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. But the idea of an annual day specifically celebrating the Flag is believed to have first originated in 1885. A Wisconsin schoolteacher arranged for the pupils in the Fredonia Public School to observe June 14 as Americas 'Flag Birthday.'

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States originated on Columbus Day, 1893. It contained no reference to Almighty God until, in New York City on April 22, 1951, the Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus adopted a resolution to amend the Pledge of Allegiance by the addition of the words "under God" after the words "one nation". At its annual meeting on August 20, 1953, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus sent copies of this resolve to the President, Vice President, Speaker of the House, and to each member of both Houses of Congress. The resolution was adopted by both Houses of Congress, and it was signed by President Eisenhower on Flag Day, June 14, 1954, thereby making official the amendment conceived, sponsored, and put into practice by the Knights of Columbus more than three years before.

- There have been 27 official versions of the American flag.
- On July 4, 2007, the present 50-star flag became the flag in longest use, surpassing the 48-star flag that was used from 1912 to 1959.
- There are flags on top of Mt. Everest, at the North and South Poles, as well as on the Moon.
- If it touches the ground, it doesn't have to be discarded, it can be washed.
- If it is too soiled or physically damaged it then has to be destroyed by burning.
- If you have an American flag that needs to be disposed of, you can take it to an American Legion or VFW Post or give it to a Knight of Columbus who will see that it is done properly and respectfully.
