
Kids Need Extra Care in Heat

The risk of heat exhaustion comes with high temperatures, high humidity, direct sun,

insufficient fluids and age. Those children younger than four are less able to regulate their body temperatures and are dependent on others for water and appropriate clothing. Signs of heat exhaustion: heavy sweating, dry lips/tongue, fast heartbeat, dark urine, weak, lethargic, headache, nausea and vomiting. Other risk factors for children: obesity, a recent illness - especially with vomiting and diarrhea, lack of acclimatization to weather and exercising beyond their level of fitness such as going from hand held games straight to vigorous athletics. Prevention measures: encourage fluids, don't leave in car even with windows open 2 inches, for even on a cloudy day temperatures can rise 20 degrees in 10 minutes, don't overwrap babies or cover the stroller with a blanket. If you feel a child is "heat exhausted" then have them lie down in cool place, remove any unnecessary clothing, cool skin with water and a fan, offer fluid - water is best. If there's no improvement after 30 minutes - seek medical help. WebMD/MedicineNet/Mayo Clinic

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



First Reading - Jeremiah 20:10-13

The prophet Jeremiah lived about 600 years before Christ. He prophesied that Israel, because of its unfaithfulness to God, would be defeated in Babylon. When this began to happen, many of his friends and neighbors denounced him as a traitor and turned on him.

Second Reading - Romans 5:12-15

Today and for many Sundays hereafter, our second reading will be taken from Paul's letter to the Romans. Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. His purpose in this passage is not to teach about original sin, but to contrast Adam and Christ. From Adam we inherited a strong pull toward sin. From Christ (the "new Adam") we received a gift that is incomparably stronger: Divine grace.

Today is the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time Just what is *Ordinary Time*?

The color green in the church tells us that we are back in Ordinary Time.

Actually the word "ordinary" does not mean routine but "counted" or "ordinal" time.

Winter Ordinary Time is just a few short weeks until we enter into the season of Lent. Summer and Fall Ordinary Time comprise the longest portion of the Liturgical Year, covering as much as six months of the Calendar.

Ordinary Time challenges us with the demands of building the Kingdom. We listen to the Word of God which keeps reminding us of our call as Christians to internalize the teachings of the Lord and to live out what we proclaim. The miracles and the parables of Jesus are, for the most part, the subject of the Gospel readings. The task that we are given is the same task Jesus had - to proclaim the reign of God in our midst - so this is hardly an ordinary mission. The prayers of the Mass ask for the gifts necessary to accomplish this task and they carry the same message: "Bring forth the Kingdom!"






