Health Ministry: Your Face Can "Talk" **About Your Health** Certain facial traits may reveal clues about your



underlying health condition...

*Yellowish Skin and Eyes - too much waste product in body. Possibly mono, hepatitis or problem with liver, pancreas, gall bladder or alcohol abuse.

*Soft Yellowish Spots on Eyelids - made of cholesterol. Could be you're more likely to get heart disease.

*Puffy Eyes and Eye Bags - could be just heredity or lack of sleep, too much salty food, age, chronic allergies.

*Sores Around Lips - Herpes virus type 1

(not one spread via sex) This virus is here to stav. These "cold sores" break out when sick, anxious, over-tired or out in sun too long.

*Hair in Unusual Places - Happens to men as they get older around eyebrows and ears; older women on upper lip and chin. Hair found on the face or pimples on chin and cheeks of younger women (past puberty) could mean cysts on ovaries (more difficult to get pregnant) or hormone imbalance.

*Moles - Usually nothing to worry about, but skin checks can help spot cancer before spreads. If you notice any new changes tell your doctor. WebMD/Health Prevention/Reader's Digest

Elisha, who lived about 800 years before Christ, succeeded the great prophet Elijah, and was noted for his miraculous deeds. Today we hear of one such deed performed in gratitude for the hospitality given to him and his servant Gehazi.

Second Reading - Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

Today and for many Sundays hereafter, our second reading will be taken from Paul's letter to the Romans. In a previous section of his letter to the Romans, Paul taught that we sinners are reconciled to God through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Now Paul notes that we experience this dying and rising when, in the immersion form of baptism, we are symbolically "buried" in the water and emerge to new life.
