To help make the most of each visit with your doctor, remember these helpful tips:

- 1) Bring your health plan ID card and photo ID. Be prepared to show them at every visit.
- **2) Make a list.** Before your visit, jot down questions for your doctor, symptoms you've noticed, and a list of all the medicines and supplements you take.
- **3) Invite a buddy.** Bring a family member or friend along if you think you may need help remembering what the doctor tells you.
- **4) Speak up.** Tell your doctor about new or changing symptoms, any family history of disease and any trips outside the country. And be honest about your health habits.
- **5) Ask questions.** If you don't understand an instruction, ask your doctor to explain it again. Consider taking notes.

## **Introductions to Sunday Readings**

In the last centuries before Christ, the Jewish people hoped for a triumphant Messiah king. The prophet Zechariah spoke instead of a Messiah who would come not in splendor and glory with horses and chariots but rather in meekness and peace, riding a common work animal. All four evangelists will later apply this passage to the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem several days before his arrest.


#### Second Reading - Romans 8:9, 11-13

Today we will begin five Sundays of readings from chapter eight of Paul's letter to the Romans, a chapter which emphasized the role of the Holy Spirit. Paul wants us to remember that the Spirit who will raise our bodies on the last day is the same Spirit who inspires us to holiness every day. Today Paul offers a sharp contrast between life in the flesh (meaning *life prone to sin*) and life in the Spirit.



- 1. (c) Catholic parishes rely on the service of sacristans to care for, organize, and arrange the sacred vessels and vestments that are used for the celebration of the Eucharistic liturgy.
- 2. (b) A ciborium looks like a chalice but it has a more rounded bowl and has a cover usually surmounted with a cross.
- 3. (b) A lavabo set (*lavabo* is Latin for *l shall wash*; see Psalm 26) refers to the vessels used for washing of the priest's hands after the Offertory of the Mass.
- 4. (b) A miter is two pieces of stiff triangle-shaped material attached at the side to form a hat. Israelite priests used to wear something similar. In about the twelfth century it became the customary hat for Catholic bishops.
- 5. (a) The censer burns incense made of aromatic gum, and the rising smoke symbolizes prayers rising to heaven. The vessel is also called a "thurible."
- 6. (c) The word comes from the Latin for "shoulder blade." It's a garment covering the chest and back, worn by religious. A shorter version for laypeople is only two small pieces of cloth connected by two long cords. The most widely used is the "brown scapular" of the Carmelite Order.
