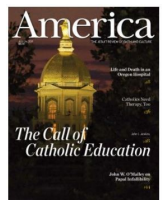

Mindfulness...What is it?



A form of meditation.

"A state of active, on purpose attention to the **present** thoughts and feelings without judging them good or bad." Live in the moment because that's where we are. The past no longer exists. The future is just a fantasy. The one moment we actually can experience is the **present** one which we seem most to avoid. When being mindful, the goal is to be attentive to one thing...**now**. Avoid dwelling on negative events from the past or worrying about the future for these thoughts cannot change what was or what will be, but can make us stressed or anxious. How to become more mindful? **Pay attention.* Really listen to another person's words and delay your mental judgment or criticism. **Focus on your breathing.* Feel your breath move in and out of your body. When your mind wanders, gently redirect attention to your breathing. **Increase your awareness* by making the familiar new again. Look at a common object, cell phone, toothbrush...etc. and identify one new detail that you hadn't noticed before. *"In today's world we all think too much - seek too much - want too much and forget about the joy of just being."* Mayo clinic/wildmind/mindful quotes

Introductions to Sunday Readings

First Reading - Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

The book of Daniel was written 150 years before Christ, during a time when the Jews were experiencing fierce persecution. It is meant to encourage the people by telling heroic stories of a person named Daniel who lived many centuries earlier. Today's reading describes his vision of heaven, and is written in symbolic language - similar to the book of Revelation. The term "Son of Man" meant a human chosen by God for a special purpose. Christians have applied this vision to Jesus.

Second Reading - 2 Peter 1:16-19

The second letter of Peter was written approximately 100 years after Jesus' death and resurrection. It was written in Peter's name, a practice common at that time. Because, after all these years, Jesus had not yet returned in glory, some people lost faith that he would ever return. Today's passage describes the Transfiguration, to which Peter was an eyewitness. The author wants to reassure the people that what they believe about Jesus is true.

Do These Questions Sound Familiar?

- 1) Is there something out there that will energize my spiritual life - some practical application of the gospel message that will give me real everyday-life ways to put my faith into action?
- 2) Is there a group I can join where I can *really* make a difference and help out others in my parish community?
- 3) Where can I find and surround myself with good, caring, upbeat people who are willing to do something positive in the world today?



If you've been thinking these kinds of questions, we hope you'll consider joining the Bereavement Ministry. The Holy Family Parish Bereavement Ministry is made up of four integral groups that offer truly invaluable services to families coping with a loved one's death. **You could be involved a little or a lot; work on a team or on your own; be a leader or a worker-bee. Almost everyone in the Bereavement Ministry serves on an as-needed basis, allowing you to participate when it fits your schedule.** The Bereavement Luncheon Coordinators do commit to an entire month and answer the call sometimes just once or twice - sometimes five or six times - during their month, but with enough people on your team, flexible schedules can be accommodated. So by its nature, there's no real set schedule.

The families that our Bereavement Ministry help at this difficult time are so appreciative. We often receive notes and donations expressing that appreciation (see below.) ***Perhaps even your family has experienced this first-hand and you're looking for a chance to pay-if-forward.*** Why not call the office 422-0602 and join in?

Ministry Planners meet with family members to help them choose readings and hymns for their loved one's funeral, as well as schedule Lectors, Servers, Greeters and Eucharistic Ministers for the Mass. They coordinate with the celebrant, organist, luncheon coordinator, and funeral home staff.

Funeral Mass Ministers volunteer as Lectors, Servers, Greeters and Eucharistic Ministers. Family members will sometimes choose to participate as Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors for the funeral. Volunteer ministers offer support by filling in as needed.

The **Bereavement Choir** group join together to sing at the funeral Mass. Volunteers don't necessarily belong to any other parish choir and there are no individual parts to sing. The songs that are chosen are familiar to every Catholic. The blending of voices in celebration of the funeral Mass are truly a comfort to the family.

The **Bereavement Luncheon** group is made up of volunteers who prepare and serve a luncheon for the family and friends after the funeral. Many volunteers donate a variety of side dishes and desserts while others work as hosts for the luncheon.

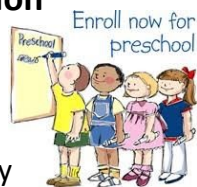

Junior High students at St. John XXIII Catholic School who show an aptitude for math are able to take high school level Algebra I and Geometry and receive high school credit for these courses. Just like they would if they were actually in High School, they must take the Ohio End of Course Exam for these subjects.

We recently received the scores for these tests and our students did very well! Our students taking the Algebra I exam averaged a 738 while the state average was a 702. Our students taking the Geometry exam averaged a 760 while the state average was a 697! Considering most students taking the exam were in high school, our students did extremely well.

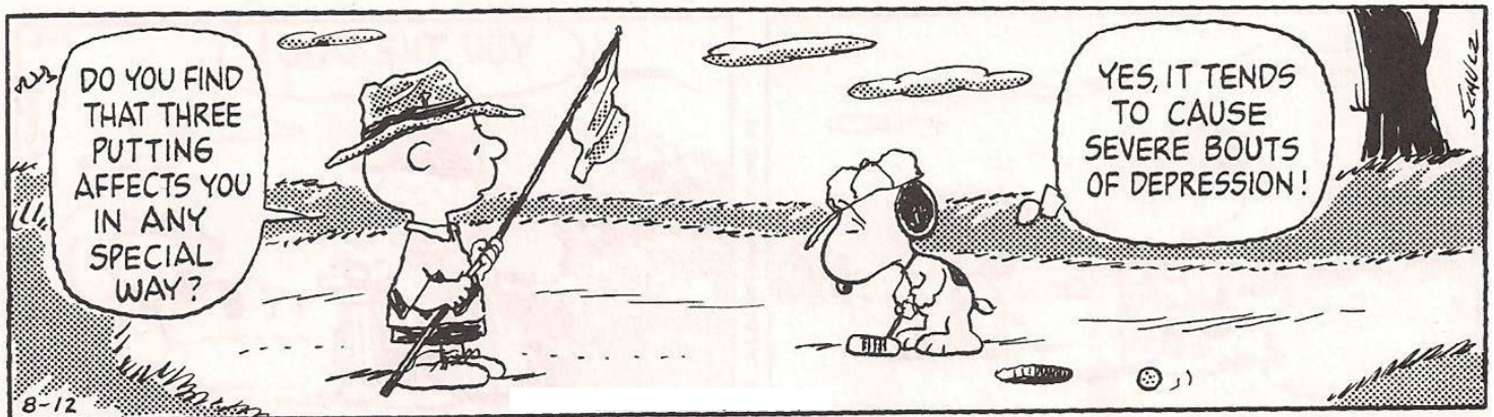
