

Two Words Hard to Say



None of us are perfect and we need the humility and courage to say these words more than once in our lifetime..."I'm Sorry."
It isn't easy to apologize, but it can do much to heal a relationship and rebuild trust.

How to express remorse:

*Make it timely. Apologize as soon as possible. A delay can indicate insincerity. On the other hand, there is no statute of limitation, for it's never to late for a sincere "I'm sorry."

*Express regret. State how much you regret what you did. Admit responsibility and be specific of how you have wronged.

*Promise you won't repeat behavior.

Bad apology mistakes

*Don't apologize by text or email. The other person needs to hear your voice tone and read your body language as proof of sincerity.

*Don't make excuses to justify your mistake. Leave the word "but" out of the apology.

*Don't apologize when you don't mean it.

*Don't say, "I'm sorry you feel that way" for you are just shifting the blame to the victim.

*Don't expect instant forgiveness. The person may need time to heal in order to forgive.

Assumption of Mary

This is usually a holy day of obligation unless it falls on a Monday or Saturday. It is a feast of the highest significance. It celebrates Mary's welcome into heaven. It is a feast for all of us because Mary, the Mother of the Church, has accomplished what each of us hopes and expects to happen.

As we believe that Jesus was the first to rise from the dead, so we believe he has also received his mother first into eternity. Eastern traditions called this event the "Dormition" or the "sleeping" of Mary indicating that she did not die but was taken to heaven as if asleep. Pope Pius XII declared the bodily assumption of Mary a dogma of the church in 1950.

The prophet Elijah lived about 800 years before Christ. Because he was loyal to God, he fell into disfavor with King Ahab and Queen Jezebel. He had to flee for his life to Mount Horeb (also known as Mount Sinai.)
As you listen to today's passage, it will be helpful to know that wind, earthquake, and fire were traditional

Old Testament expressions of God's presence.

Second Reading - Romans 9:1-5

In chapters 9 to 11 of Paul's letter to the Romans, he addresses the painful question of why the majority of Jewish people failed to accept Christ. These were Paul's own people and he was personally hurt by this. He still loved his Jewish heritage and in today's passage he lists seven wonderful blessings that God's Old Testament people have received. He then adds an eighth: Christ the Messiah.




