

"Anxiety is a Shower of What-Ifs" Anxiety is a fear or nervousness about what might happen. It is over-thinking and over-analyzing



every little irrelevant thing. You may feel restless and constantly distracted and at other times your mind goes blank. Often simple decisions become difficult. Here are some ways to stop feeling anxious right now.

- **1.** Stay in your time zone the present.
- 2. Breathe deeply. This helps to slow down and re-center your mind. 3. Follow the 3-3-3 Rule. Look around and name 3 things you see, name 3 sounds you hear, and finally move 3 parts of your body. This helps you center your mind and bring you back to the present.
- **4.** Stay away from sugar, for too much of it worsens feelings of anxiety. **5.** Explain your worries to a trusted friend. Often concerns expressed aloud or written down can help you to see them clearly for what they are.

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Ezekiel 33:7-9



Ezekiel was an Old Testament prophet who ministered to the Jewish people exiled in Babylon. In this passage, the speaker is God who uses the image of a watchman to describe a prophet's role. In those times, a watchman was someone who stood on a hill or in a tower to watch for invaders.

Second Reading - Romans 13:8-10

In the concluding section of his letter to the Romans, Paul writes about the moral demands of Christian life. This letter was written some years before the Gospels, yet these words will sound very much like words we hear in the Gospels. Clearly, Paul is drawing upon a pre-Gospel tradition about what Jesus said.




