### Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



#### First Reading - Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

When today's passage from the book of Isaiah was written, the Jewish people had been held in exile in Babylon for more than 40 years. Cyrus, the king of neighboring Persia, was preparing to invade Babylon. The prophet sees Cyrus, a pagan king, as an instrument of God. Through his military victory, God will free his people and allow them to return home.

#### Second Reading - 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5

Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians is the earliest of all New Testament writings, coming only about 20 years after the Resurrection of Jesus. Today's reading gives us the letter's opening words. In just five verses we hear reference to God the Father, the Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit, and also to faith, hope and love. It indicates how quickly these essentials of our faith became part of our Christian tradition.

## Holy Family Parish St. Vincent de Paul Society - Report of Activities for 2016 - 2017



Your St. Vincent de Paul Conference recently completed the 2016-17 fiscal year. We thought you might be interested in a report of our activities as we gratefully receive your financial and prayerful support throughout the year. The SVDP Ministry is made up of several components, each summarized below. *HFP SVDP President Ray Kelly*

**OUTREACH** This program has been in existence for a little over three years. Over this period, it has expanded from one inventory storage facility to a Hook Field hangar. The hangar was made available to us through the good graces of the City of Middletown at a nominal fee. Sandy Ongkiko and Judy Dixon pioneered this project and currently head up a group of 25+ volunteers who collect, store and deliver furniture and basic household items to our clients. This group establishes dialogue with our needy neighbors via home visits to identify and address basic furniture and household needs. They, along with the Prison Ministry led by Mike Kelley, come closest to meeting the evangelistic objectives of SVDP. Members of the volunteer group submit writings of their experiences with clientele which appear periodically in the Sunday bulletin. **For the fiscal year, Outreach conducted 196 home visits and served the needs of 567 people.**

**HELP LINE** This activity, as the name may suggest, offers a telephone contact for those in need of assistance with their utility bills - Duke and water. Volunteers make themselves available Monday through Friday working out of their homes. In addition to utilities assistance, SVDP reps are able to direct clients to other social services located in Middletown and elsewhere. **Help Line responded to 508 requests for assistance at an expense of over \$18,500. Judy Dixon & Alice Brown direct this group.**

**PANTRY** Tracing its origin to the founding days of SVDP, this program has continued to expand over the years to where it is the most active in the Hamilton District. **Under the leadership of Frank and Judy Pressler, the Pantry provided food to 3,460 in fiscal 2016/17. This translates to ~ \$13,000 and 13+ tons of food products.**

We purchase food on a monthly basis through Shared Harvest in Hamilton. We also receive food donations from Fenwick and St. John XXIII students and faculty. The Pantry operates weekly on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Clients are screened and referred to us by Family Services. Marsh Supermarket (now Needler's Fresh Market) has supplied us with bread and pastries for several years and we recently expanded pick up to four times each week. **Also as part of the Pantry, four years ago we began to purchase all of the formula for the Community Pregnancy Center.** CPC handles distribution and screening. **In this fiscal year, we bought 209 containers of formula at \$3,500.** The Pantry provides food for Thanksgiving and Christmas, and last year did so for 110 families. In addition to the Christmas food baskets, gifts are purchased by parishioners via the Giving Tree Star ornaments. Alice Brown coordinates the Christmas project. Frank & Judy have elected to take a less active role in the day to day operation of the Pantry. Laura Niemer will be directing this activity.

**OTHER** For several years Mike Kelley has lead a **Prison Ministry** that offers non-denominational services at the Middletown Jail and Butler County Correction Center. Consisting of spiritual readings and discussions, this activity offers inmates the opportunity to set aside their troubled experience and reflect on life in a peaceful atmosphere. In September 2017, 60 people in Middletown and 10 in Butler County participated. John Lyons, our Treasurer, and Mike Wade have delivered lunches for the elementary school **Back Pack Program** for the past several years. **About 125 youngsters**

Services prepares the packs for John and Mike to deliver and SVDP pays for the students of St. John XXIII who receive lunches. Also for many years, Charlie Rouster has lead a group of volunteers in **delivering monthly food boxes to the senior high rises in Middletown.** This does not involve an expense to the Conference; it does represent the donation of volunteer hours. Charlie also provides transportation for Outreach and monthly pick up of Pantry supplies from Shared Harvest.

**FINANCES** St. Vincent de Paul is a separate financial entity from Holy Family Parish. Everything is accomplished through volunteers. All expenditures are local and we do not contribute to other charities. We are very serious about our fiduciary responsibility to you, our fellow parishioners. For fiscal year 2016-17, 5th Sunday Collections provide 28% (\$20,049) of our total donation income and offset 30% of total expenses. We expect these percentages to increase as we recently included a special 5th Sunday Collection envelope in the regular monthly pack. **The response of the parish has been remarkable!** In addition, 30% (\$21,844) of our income came from donations and memorial contributions. Grants from the Middletown Community Foundation, the Barnitz Fund, and McGraw-Kokosing accounted for 42% (\$30,545) of donations. Al Heckler writes our financial grant requests.

**CONCLUSION** Holy Family should be very proud of their SVDP. **When we reflect on how many people are helped through your contributions, the result is staggering! Over 5,000 people receive our care!** It would be wonderful if we could report that our ministries are no longer needed, but that's just not the case. We are so grateful for your support! Thank you so very much!
