

Did You Remember to Change the Batteries in Your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors?



Everyone knows to turn clocks back an hour to the appropriate new time. Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Wisdom 6:12-16



The book of Wisdom was written by a teacher who lived in Alexandria, Egypt, a center for Greek philosophy in the ancient world. Fearful that the Jewish people might be captivated by this secular thought, the author contrasts it with the true wisdom of God. In today's passage, wisdom is personified as a women. Second Reading - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Paul wrote his first letter to the Thessalonians some 20 years before any of the Gospels were written. In the passage we're about to hear, we have the earliest written teaching about the resurrection. Some of the Thessalonians were worried about those who had already died. They expected the second coming of Christ very soon, and were concerned that those who had died would miss out on the resurrection.



A Veteran's Story - Father James McNary

When war was declared in April of 1917 Father James McNary was the pastor of St. Mary's in Hamilton. On September 20, 1917 the first large group of Hamilton boys were given a massive send off by the city with a stirring speech by Father McNary, described by the *Hamilton Evening Journal* as "filled with inspiring thoughts and ringing with true Americanism." In July of 1918, Father McNary enlisted in the Army and was quickly sent to France as a chaplain. His many letters home, some printed in the *Hamilton Evening Journal*, painted a vivid picture of war. On October 10, 1918 Father McNary wrote of his experience at the front, beginning with a four-hour nighttime march from camp. He approached the trenches "…amidst the most terrible barrage, which began at 1 a.m. To my mind it COMBINED ALL THE TERRORS OF ALL THE THUNDER AND LIGHTENING STORMS I have ever been through or expect to go through in



my life... The barrage continued until 5:30 and we rested in trenches for a time, during which I said mass...at 7 over the top I went with my company. We were in support and crawled along, dodging enemy shells of gas and shrapnel, machine guns shooting at 500 per minute, snipers then in case all else failed. For two days we did that and then we took the front line and it was our privilege to capture Mountfaucon..." To his own surprise, Father James McNary, (subsequently Monsignor McNary) survived his harrowing wartime encounters and returned to Butler County, where he served as priest of Holy Trinity parish in Middletown for 37 years.
