



- 1. Don't beat yourself up because you aren't "perfect" at caregiving.
- 2. Remember that even if you cannot take a big break, little breaks help, too.
- 3. Tell other family members that you're not mad at them. It's just that, "I've used up all my nice." Tell them what you want: alone time, a hug, chocolate....
- 4. Don't hesitate to ask for or even demand help.
- 5. Forgive yourself for the times you have lost your temper.
- 6. Enjoy and relish the joyful moments with your care receiver!
- 7. Admit that what you are doing is difficult. It is!
- 8. Remember that your older loved one's condition may become worse, that he or she may die, but it is *not* your fault.
- 9. Pray. Yelling at... speaking loudly at God can be a prayer that comes straight from the heart.
- 10. Know that you are not alone, even though at times you feel lonely. God has asked you to do this and you have accepted His invitation. He is with you always. Right here. Right now.
