Health Ministry:

So What's Good About Cold Weather?

We are aware of the downside of cold weather: hypothermia, frostbite, increased danger for those with heart disease or asthma, amplified joint stiffness/pain of arthritics and increased chance of migraines. What about the upside of cold weather?



**Burn more calories and lose weight.*

The body needs to burn extra fat to produce energy to heat back up to the ideal temp.

**Can decrease insect population.*

Extended low temperatures can kill off some insects, leaving fewer to buzz, bite, sting and spread disease the following season.

**Less crime* which historically drops during Winter...EXCEPT auto theft which may increase due to cars left running in driveways while owners wait for them to warm-up inside.

**Brings a greater appreciation* of brighter and warmer days. They will seem even better when they finally come.

**Brains work better in cooler temperatures.*

**Lack of pollen.* In general, plants don't make pollen in the Winter.

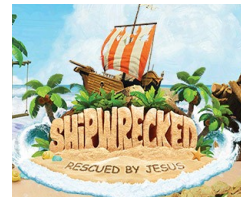
Second Reading - Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

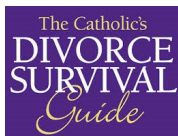

EPIPHANY QUIZ ANSWERS

1. (c) The tradition that there were three arises from the three gifts that were given to the Holy Family.
2. (a) Quirinius was the Roman governor of Syria. Caesar Augustus was the chief of the Roman state. Flavius Joseph was the Jewish historian who chronicled Herod's reign.
3. (d) The Rev. John H. Hopkins, an Episcopal priest, wrote the text of this hymn in 1857 for a Christmas pageant at the General Theological Seminary in New York City. Phillips Brooks, also an Episcopal priest, wrote the text to "O Little Town of Bethlehem" in 1865. Father Josef Mohr wrote the text to "Stille Nacht" ("Silent Night") in 1816. Charles Wesley, the brother of John Wesley, wrote the text to "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" in (about) 1739.
4. (a) Luke jumps from the Nativity to when Jesus was twelve years old. Mark begins his Gospel with John the Baptist and the baptism of Jesus. John begins before the creation of the earth and then recounts Jesus' adult ministry.
5. (d) The Greek components are *epi-* meaning "on" or "to" and *-phainein* meaning "to show."
6. (d) Huey, Dewey and Louie are Donald Duck's nephews. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were the three young Hebrew men cast into the fiery furnace by King Nebuchadnezzar (Daniel 3:1-29). Peter, Paul and James are all apostles.
7. (c) Myrrh comes from the trees Commiphora myrrha and/or Balsamodendron kua. Merbromin or Mercurochrome was an antiseptic in the United States until it was banned in 1998 because of the fear of mercury poisoning. Fiddah is the Arabic word for silver. Nutmeg is of the species Myristica fragrans.
