## Health Ministry: Too Sick to Go to School?

Many parents have a hard time deciding if their kids are well enough to go to school or child care. After all, what well-meaning parent hasn't gotten that mid morning "come get your child" phone call? Trust your instincts and these guidelines to

\* who has a **fever** (higher than 100.4 taken by mouth *without* fever reducing medicine)

decide: NEVER send your child to school

- \* has a **severe headache** or **earache**
- \* is wheezing or short of breath
- \* is **nauseated**, **vomiting** or has **diarrhea**.
- \* if you know the illness is contagious such as flu, chicken pox, pink eye, impetigo, or a sore throat lasting more than 48 hours, especially with a fever and throat is spotty with red and white patches as it could be strep throat.

  Keep your child home until diagnosed and the doctor gives the OK. Kids who lose their appetites, are clingy or lethargic, complain of pain or who are not "acting themselves" should also take a sick day. What about a mild cold? You don't have to sideline a kid, but keep in mind he/she may still pass the virus on to somebody else.




