Go Ahead, Have a Good Cry: 5 Reasons Why It's Good for You

Researchers have proven what many caregivers have already figured out on their own:



sometimes there's nothing like a good cry to make you feel better. Crying is cathartic.

- **1.** It relieves stress. Unalleviated stress can increase our risk for heart attack and damage certain areas of our brain.
- **2.** A good cry has been found to lower both blood pressure and pulse rate.
- **3.** Tears actually remove toxins from the body. Tears help humans remove chemicals that build up during emotional stress.
- **4.** The simple act of crying also reduces the body's manganese level, a mineral which affects mood and is found in up to 30 times greater concentration in tears than in blood serum.
- **5.** Emotional crying means you're human. While the eyes of all mammals are moistened and soothed by tears, only human beings shed tears in response to emotional stress. Emotional expression acknowledges the feelings you're having. Emotions motivate us to empathize, coordinate and work as a unit to best survive So, next time you feel those tears welling up or that lump in your throat, go ahead, have a good cry. by Marlo Sollitto www.agingcare.com



Introductions to Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor





A covenant is a solemn agreement between two parties in which each promises something. The book of Exodus recounts how the Jews escaped from slavery in Egypt and made a covenant with God on Mount Sinai. The heart of that covenant is this: God promises to accept the Israelites as his people. On their part, they must promise to keep God's commandments.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

Paul wrote to his Corinthian converts about the difficulty in preaching about a crucified savior: To *Jewish* people who looked for a powerful Messiah performing spectacular signs, it seemed unacceptable that the Messiah would suffer and die. To *Gentiles*, it seemed entirely absurd that someone who died such a humiliating death could be the savior.

10:30 AM Mass

First Reading - Exodus 17:3-7

The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their wanderings in the wilderness. Their trials during that time, the way they faced them <u>and</u> the way God responded, provided future generations with food for thought whenever they faced difficulties.

Second Reading - Romans 5:1-2,5-8

In writing to the Romans, Paul is dealing with a community he had not yet visited. Many Roman Christians were converts from Judaism who believed they would be saved by how they lived out the Jewish Law. Paul stresses here, as he does frequently in his writings, that Christians are saved not by the Law, but by faith — faith in what Jesus accomplished by his dying and rising.






