This weekend Rev. Raju Pilla will be speaking about the works and needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India.

Trivandrum has about 270,000 Catholics. 90% of the people are traditional fishermen who depend on fishing for their livelihood and 10% are farm workers who are recent converts from low caste Hindus. "Harvest is plentiful but Laborers are few!"



Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in this community. The Archdiocese depends on outside assistance to support its clergy, seminarians, Catechists and to continue its developmental programs for the Community. Several coastal villages of the Archdiocese were hit by the 'Ockhi' Cyclone on November 30, 2017. More than 289 young fishermen lost their lives while doing deep sea fishing. There is so much sadness and devastation in their villages. Many young catholic families lost their men and everything they had. We are looking for emergency assistance to help the children especially, with food, and housing.

Health Ministry: Sun Exposure The Good - The Bad - The Practical

Sunshine is a mixed blessing. The sun's ultraviolet radiation is a known carcinogen and yet short periods of time spent in the sun may have some health benefits. The possible good... spending a **very limited time** in the sun without sunscreen may have health benefits - 1: Vitamin D synthesis which occurs in the skin in response to sun's rays. "Vitamin D is absolutely essential to promote absorption of calcium, the mineral that keeps bones strong." 2: Studies suggest sun exposure may promote better sleep, improved mood, healthier immune system and possibly curb appetite and might be linked to longevity. The definite bad...these same sun rays which can be helpful "are also the same type that causes sunburn. There are no health benefits to getting scorched - it's probably the single most dangerous thing you can do to your skin!" The practical...in the summer you need only

The practical...in the summer you need only about 10 minutes of sun on small area of unprotected skin to produce enough Vitamin D.

For the remainder of sun time apply sunscreen, especially to face and hands which always get sun and so are at high risk for cancer, wrinkles and brown spots. Wear a hat and sunglasses. Although harms associated with overexposure outweigh the benefits, the beneficial effects of UV rays should not be ignored in developing new sun safety guidelines. *cr.org/health*


The Men's Fellowship Group

First Reading - Acts 2:1-11


Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebration. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

Paul's first letter to the Corinthians responds to a letter they wrote to him. They had asked him how to deal with the diversity of gifts in community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitably arose. In today's passage, he uses a comparison that we will recognize immediately.

Rejoice and Be Glad

Apostolic Exhortation by Pope Francis





in his new document on holiness. "Do not be afraid of holiness. It will take away none of your energy, vitality or joy," the pope wrote in "Gaudete et Exsultate" ("Rejoice and Be Glad"), his apostolic exhortation on "the call to holiness in today's world." Below is the fourth of six excerpts from this apostolic letter.

"Each in his or her own way" the Council says.

We should not grow discouraged before examples of holiness that appear unattainable. There are some testimonies that may prove helpful and inspiring, but that we are not meant to copy, for that could even lead us astray from the one specific path that the Lord has in mind for us. The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts (cf. 1 Cor 12:7), rather than hopelessly trying to imitate something not meant for them.

We are all called to be witnesses, but there are many actual ways of bearing witness.
