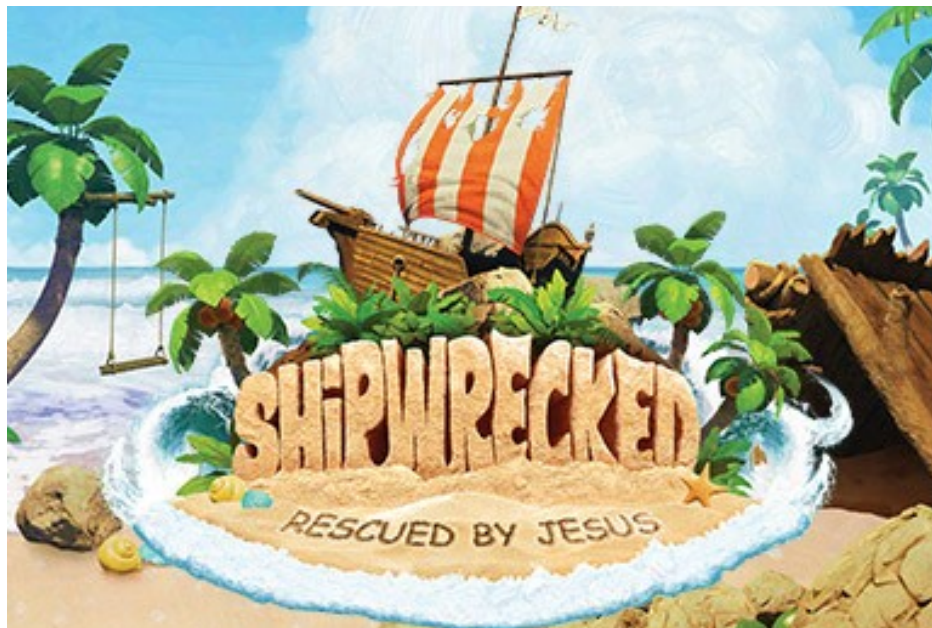

Health Ministry:

What Causes Us to Over Eat?

If we only ate when we felt true hunger, few of us would struggle with our weight. The obvious causes: *emotional eating* (make ourselves happy, ease boredom or stress), *environmental triggers* (food promoted and advertised everywhere) and *out of habit* (guilt about wasting food, especially for "Clean Plate Club" members). There are other reasons we overeat without realizing it: ***Variety** - "sensory-specific-satiety." When eating, we get used to the taste, which means we get less pleasure and feel full for that specific food and stop eating. When we eat a varied plate of food, switching between food continues to renew our taste...and we'll tend to eat four times as much! ***Distraction** - activities (watching TV, working, checking PC) disrupts our awareness of feeling full and our memory of how much food has been eaten. ***Alcohol** - decreases self-control, increases impulsiveness and can make food taste better. ***Eating with others** - we tend to use other's eating behavior as a guide for our own. We feel a strong need to identify with them.

Introductions to Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



First Reading - Genesis 3:9-15

Today we are reading from the third chapter of the book of Genesis. This chapter gives a highly symbolic account of the origin and effects of sin. Today's excerpt deals with the effects of sin.

Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 4:13—5:1

When Paul wrote the second letter to the Corinthians, he was probably in his fifties. In the life expectancy back then, only three in every 100 persons lived to be this old. In today's passage Paul writes about the effects of aging and about death. But because he had experienced the risen Lord, he saw these problems in a different light.

SVDP Outreach Ministry - A Personal Story

Though most of our clients tend to be young to middle aged, we also receive requests for help from those who are senior citizens. Need is not just found in a specific demographic, but is wide-spread. Last month we received a call from a social services agency about a 65 year old woman who had complex health issues and was in need of furniture. She had been living in an apartment for the past four months that her family placed her with only bedroom furniture. A home visit assessment was completed and we were able to supply her with a couch and a recliner, making her daily living much more comfortable. She was thrilled to be able to read, watch tv and enhance her home bound-status.

END OF YEAR AWARDS

The McConnell family once again generously funded the money for us to give out the **Vivian McConnell Volunteerism Award**. This award is given to a current 7th grade student or students and provides up to \$1,000 towards their 8th grade tuition to St. John XXIII Catholic School.

Vivian McConnell is the mother of eight children, all of whom attended Catholic School, and was widowed at the young age of 44. Even as a single parent, with very little time to herself, she always volunteered. She was a Girl Scout and Cub Scout leader, gave her time to the cafeteria at school, and ran the Holy Trinity Church and John XXIII School Bingo for almost 30 years which allowed us to keep tuition costs at a minimum. When at the age of 78, Vivian felt she could no longer devote the time and effort it took to run Bingo, this program ended at our school and parish.

All 7th grade students are required to compose an essay on volunteerism. These essays are then "blindly" scored by a committee of teachers so the writers are not identifiable. While there were many, many thought-provoking and inspiring essays, this year one essay stood out above all of the others.
