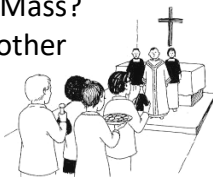

### Sparkler & Fireworks Safety

More than 50,000 fires are caused by fireworks every year. Take the proper precautions when operating fireworks.



- Never disassemble or try to make your own fireworks.
- Don't point sparklers or fireworks at yourself or others, especially while they're being lit.
- Only light fireworks on the ground and in areas that are dry and fire resistant.
- Don't attempt to light multiple devices at the same time.
- Never allow young children to handle fireworks or sparklers.
- Always keep a portable fire extinguisher close by.
- Also keep a water hose or buckets of water nearby to put out fires.

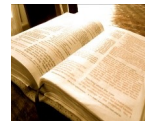

## Introductions to Readings

*by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor*

**First Reading - Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24**



The book of Wisdom was addressed to a group of Jews living in Alexandria, Egypt. It begins with a sharp contrast between good and evil. In the pagan world of that time, most people believed that there were good gods and bad gods. The author emphasizes the Jewish belief that there is just one God who is the source only of goodness and life.

**Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15**

Today's excerpt from Second Corinthians paints a picture of Paul the pastor at work. The Jewish people in Jerusalem who had become Christian were a small minority and were being persecuted. This brought on financial hardships. Paul wants his Gentile converts in Greece to help them out and show that the bonds of Christianity cut across ethnic lines.

Dear Friends in Christ,

At times throughout our nation's history, certain events take place that animate the public and force us to ask who we are as an American people. As a community of believers in Christ Jesus, who commanded us to build His Kingdom of love on Earth as it exists in Heaven, we are called to turn to our Catholic values in such moments and play an active role in shaping our culture and civic life. We do so tirelessly on such social concerns as abortion, racism, poverty, religious freedom and more.

Events of this past week provided a galvanizing moment for Catholic Social Teaching. I echo my brother bishops, and Pope Francis himself, in condemning the practices of family separation that were taking place at an unprecedented rate on our nation's southern border. The human family is the most fundamental building block of society. The bonds between parents and children are God's gift for how we begin to experience love itself and God's very presence within humanity. In fact, the family is where we first learn to be human. This is a universal truth that applies to families who have U.S. citizenship, those who were born in other places, and even those who have crossed our borders without permission. Governments at any level exist to serve the structure of the family, not the other way around.

These recent events tested our Catholic Social Teaching on the dignity of the human family and each human person. Thank you for your recent prayers and actions in defense of this principle. We still have grave concerns about what happened and what still may take place. But the public outcry, which included the voices of so many of the Catholic faithful, seems to have halted the immediate crisis of the separation of these families. I am grateful for the strong, united witness of our Catholic faith.

Moving forward, I reiterate the call, one which the U.S. Catholic bishops have proclaimed for decades, for a comprehensive reform of our immigration laws. There is undeniably a need for a greater balance among national security, legal means of entry and humane enforcement of our laws. Congress is currently debating legislation now which the U.S. Catholic bishops oppose, as it would further encumber our immigration system rather than improve it. I encourage all the faithful to urge Congress to fix these problems once and for all through a bipartisan effort of fundamental immigration reform. ### Thomas B. Fordham Institute

Regardless of where you stand on the debate currently raging over school discipline, one thing seems certain; Self-discipline is far better than the externally imposed kind. Over the years, Catholic schools, including St. John XXIII, have been committed to the formation of sound character which includes the students acquisition of self-discipline.

The Thomas B. Fordham Institute recently completed a study which revealed that our efforts have been successful. Their analysis revealed three key findings:

Students in Catholic schools are less likely to act out or be disruptive than those in other private schools or in public schools.

Students in Catholic schools exhibit more self-control than those in other private schools or public schools. Specifically, they were more likely to control their temper, respect others' property, accept their fellow students' ideas, and handle peer pressure.

Regardless of demographics, students in Catholic schools exhibit more self-discipline than students in public schools and other private schools.
