# **Health Ministry:**

# Mosquitoes-z-z-z Bite - Why Me?

In the first place, mosquitoes don't bite, rather pierce the skin. Only the females "bite" humans and only because they need the protein and iron to reproduce. A blood meal is needed before they can lay eggs. The resulting itchy bumps are an allergic response to the mosquito saliva. Mosquitos are attracted to the carbon dioxide, lactic acid and octenol (a mushroomlike smell) found in our breath and sweat. They also sense the heat and humidity that surrounds our bodies. Mosquitoes may also have a preference for beer drinkers. *Genetics* plays a major part to whom the insect is attracted: \*Higher the body temperature the greater chance you will be bitten. \*Sweet skin - not sugar, but level of lactate produced by body when exercise. Some foods may cause body to produce lactic acid (vogurt and fermented foods). \*Co2 release is largely dependent on your genes and/or your size which offers more skin surface. What to do? Replace all stagnant water in yard every week. Don't go out after dark. Use insect repellent containing DEET, which doesn't kill insects but disorients them. Good News:


# **SVDP Outreach Ministry**

# Answers to the Special Terms Catholic Faith Quiz

- 1. (b) The word comes from the Latin word for *holy*. The sanctuary is to be set apart in some way from the rest of the church.
- 2. (a) The reserved Sacrament is the Real Presence of Christ. The faithful can see at a glance whether it is present in the tabernacle by noticing whether the sanctuary lamp is lit.
- 3. (b) The sacristy is usually a room near the altar or sometimes near the main entrance of the church.
- 4. (a) From the Latin word *calyx* for "cup," a chalice is made of gold or other valued material that is not porous.
- 5. (c) The word "ciborium" comes from the Latin word for *food*.
- 6. (b) The Latin root of this word simply means "to show," as in the word "demonstrate." Some monstrances have gold rays like the sun around the host.
