Like the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation to which it is closely linked, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be repeated as often as necessary. There is no need nor reason to wait for the last possible moment. You're encouraged to call the parish office 422-0602 if you would like to receive the Anointing of the Sick for yourself or a loved one.

Health Ministry: Do You Have a Controlling Personality?

Everyone has some controlling traits, but there are those who



have "an obsessive need to exercise control over themselves, others and any situation."
It's driven by low self-esteem and high levels of anxiety (deep-seated fears) which destroys relationships. Possible traits of a controller:
Self-centered; concerned chiefly with own interests.
Expects admiration, attention and regular compliments.
Has a temper and uses it often.
Puts your confidence down; squashes your self-esteem.
Tries to change others; make you more like them.
Criticizes others in the attempt to make themselves more impressive.

• Can't accept or understand the word no.

Has low self-esteem; is moody and jealous.
Gets frustrated with questions if they don't know the answer; will lie rather than admit they don't know.
Uses controlling language - not requests, but commands, for example, *I need you to do this now. I didn't ask your opinion. Don't interrupt me.*
