
Parish Religious Education Programs



Health Ministry: Possible Causes/Solutions for Controlling Personalities **Possible Causes:**



1. Certain parenting styles where * Love was conditional and achievement-based. The child didn't feel loved until they performed to meet their parents' needs. *Tasks were valued over relationships. What you produced was more important than who you were. *Nurturing was unreliable and inconsistent. The child learns to be wary of relying on or trusting of others and becomes fiercely independent, but often has bouts of intense loneliness. 2. Significant loss or hurt in past - the person develops the mindset that will not let anything or anyone hurt them again. 3. Covering up low self-esteem and insecurities for the sake of ego and pride. **Possible Solutions:**

1. Soften your approach. Are you making demands or threats? Take responsibility for your feelings. **2. Foster co-operation.** Strive to find common ground. Give and take. Welcome input and work collaboratively. **3. Tend to your anxiety.** Explore the source of your anxiety without projecting it on others. Strive to identify what triggers your wish to control others.

Introductions to Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15



The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their journey to Mount Sinai some 1,200 years before Christ. The bread described in today's reading is called *manna*, a word derived from the ancient Hebrew words for "what is this?"

Second Reading - Ephesians 4:17, 20-24 In our series of readings from the letter to the Ephesians, we have come to a part of the letter which gives advice for daily living. Today's reading describes the effects of baptism. In the waters of baptism, we symbolically die to one way of living and rise to a new way of life.

Our school community is the foundation on which our core principles of faith and hard work bind us together as a family.

ADVANCED MATH

Once again this year, we offered high school level math classes for those students who showed an aptitude in this subject area, and once again this year, these students excelled according to the State of Ohio End of Course Exams.

These courses, Algebra I and Geometry, are taught by a high school certified teacher using the same curriculum, as well as the same text books, that are used in the high schools. In order to get high school credit for these courses, all students must take and pass an end of course exam.

Our students in grades 7 and 8 are not judged against their peers, rather they are held to the same standards that high school students taking the test are.

The state average for all students taking the Algebra I exam was a 703. Our grade 8 students taking the exam averaged a 721, and our grade 7 students taking the exam averaged a 749!

The state average for all students taking the Geometry exam was a 692. I am ecstatic to report that our student average for the Geometry exam was a 756!! This score lands our students in the highest level for the test which is Advanced.

We are so proud of our students and all of the effort and hard work they put into their studies!
