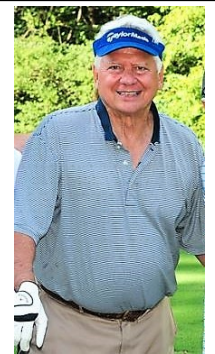

Facing the Realities of Aging

Some people ease into aging gradually and gracefully. For others, aging seems almost to drop out of the sky. We all know that aging will pose challenges, but we don't fully understand until we're actually there. Below are some insights and suggestions from people who have been there, in the hope that they will aid you in your own journey.



- **Accept your current capabilities.**

As our capabilities inevitably begin to decline, we tend to persuade ourselves that it's not really so bad after all and find comfort in focusing on the things we can still do.

- **Make peace with regrets.**

Regrets from the past - whether things that were done or things that were neglected - can spoil the present, but only if you give them the power to do so.

- **Learn the art of letting go.**

Grieving over a loss is necessary and healthy. Getting stuck in grief is not. As we age, we reach points where we must (or should) bid farewell to treasured people, situations, positions, places and abilities that delighted us. Trying to hold onto them can occupy too much room in our mind and heart, and prevent us from accepting and fully living in our new circumstances.

- **Give your diminishment meaning and purpose.**

Introductions to Readings

First Reading - 1 Kings 19:4-8

The prophet Elijah lived about 800 years before Christ. Because he was loyal to God, he fell into disfavor with King Ahab and Queen Jezebel. He had to flee for his life to Mount Horeb (also known as Mount Sinai). Today's passage takes place as he begins his flight.

Second Reading - Ephesians 4:30-5:2

As in the past four Sundays, our second Scripture reading is from the letter to the Ephesians. This part of the letter contains advice for Christian living. The author says that actions which cause division in a community are simply unacceptable. In today's reading, the author sees mutual forgiveness as essential for any group that calls itself Christian. There is an echo here of part of the Lord's prayer.

SVDP Outreach Ministry -

A Personal Story

Last month a disabled single mother with an autistic 17-year-old son was relocated from a homeless shelter in Dayton to an efficiency apartment in Middletown. They arrived with only some clothes, a couple of pillows and sleeping bags. A social worker gave her our contact number for assistance. Their efficiency apartment is very small. The client requested two twin beds, a loveseat and a microwave oven. A friend (and occasional volunteer for SVDP Furniture Outreach) made a monetary donation that covered the purchase of the beds. We were able to deliver a donated loveseat, a microwave on a rolling cart and bed linens. Our delivery team recognized how difficult it would be for this mother and son to assemble the frames and set up the beds. The team graciously offered to take their time to do the assembly and dispose of the boxes and the plastic wrapping from the mattresses. This added a bit of time to the delivery schedule but was very appreciated by mom and son. The efficiency apartment is packed, but the client and her son are thrilled. *Thanks, Holy Family Parishioners, for your donations of time and treasure!*

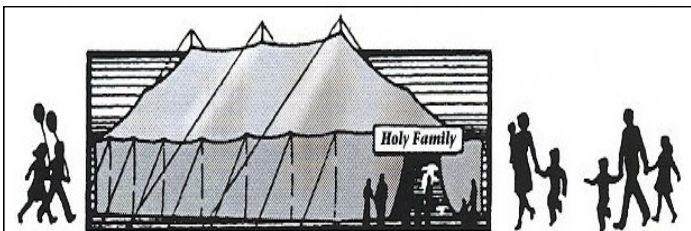

Feast of the Assumption of Mary

Wednesday, August 15th — Mass at 12:10 & 7 PM

This is a holy day of obligation unless it falls on a Monday or Saturday. It is a feast of the highest significance. It celebrates Mary's welcome into heaven. It is a feast for all of us because Mary, the Mother of the Church, has accomplished what each of us hopes and expects to happen.

As we believe that Jesus was the first to rise from the dead, so we believe he has also received his mother first into eternity. Eastern traditions called this event the "Dormition" or the "sleeping" of Mary indicating that she did not die but was taken to heaven as if asleep. Pope Pius XII declared the bodily assumption of Mary a dogma of the church in 1950.
