

Why Floss, Too?

Each tooth has five surfaces! A toothbrush cleans the top and outer surfaces. **Floss** is needed to clean the two tight spaces between the teeth and under the gums in the gap at the base of the teeth. Without floss you're cleaning only three of the five surfaces! Bacteria which live in the mouth feast on leftover food particles to create a sticky, soft and colorless **plaque** which produces an acid which can cause cavities and gum disease. Flossing can remove plaque, but if not removed in the soft stage it becomes **tartar** which is hard, crusty and yellow/brown. Tartar can only be removed with dental, scraping equipment. Besides discolored teeth and bad breath, bacteria left to flourish in the mouth can harm the rest of the body and lead to heart disease, respiratory problems, diabetes complications and more. How to floss:

1. Use a piece of floss 15 to 18 inches long.
2. Slide the floss between teeth.
3. Wrap it around each tooth in shape of "C".
4. Polish with an up and down motion.

(Most of us get step 2...but skip 3 and 4!)



Answers to the Special "Back-to-School" Quiz

1. (c) St. Thomas (1226-1274) was canonized in 1323 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V. A Dominican friar and a university professor, Aquinas wrote the *Summa Theologica*, a summary of theology. His feast day is January 28.
2. (c) Archbishop Carroll, the first American bishop, convinced the other clergy in 1829 that Catholic schools were "absolutely necessary" to teach the Catholic faith and to make Catholics equal members of society.
3. (c) The Poor Clare Sisters were started by St. Clare of Assisi (1194-1253). They live in an enclosed monastery, embracing a life of community, contemplation, poverty, and joy.
4. (a) The Greek word *katekhein* means "to sound over, to echo the oral teaching."
5. (c) Paul studied "at the feet of Gamaliel" (Acts 22:3), a celebrated scholar of the Jewish law. Elsewhere, Gamaliel counsels the Sanhedrin to stay away from the Apostles, who were arrested for proclaiming the Risen Christ (see Acts 5:34).
6. (d) Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton founded the Sisters of Charity of Saint Joseph and established a network of schools that became a model for parochial schools throughout the U.S.
