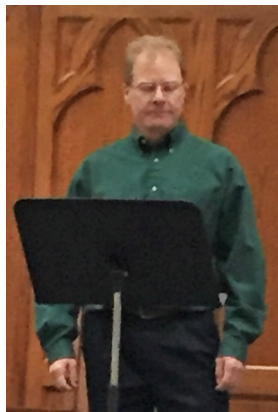

Health Ministry:

Pastor Appreciation Month

How can we show it?

Why do so many pastors

leave the ministry? Too much work, rigid work schedule, difficult parishioners, being on call 24 hours a day, excessive bureaucracy, emotional exhaustion and **too little support**.

WE can help to take the pressure off our pastor:

1. Attend church as a disciple of Jesus rather than as a consumer. Don't expect our pastor or deacon to always give an inspiring message - what we receive from church service is *mostly* what we put into it. **2. Don't criticize our pastor or deacon.** Ask yourself instead what did I learn from the sermon? How was I encouraged? Did I experience God in church today?

3. Thank our pastor or deacon. Speak it.

Drop a short note (may include a gift card to a nice local restaurant or Amazon).

Priesthood is not a lucrative profession.

4. Bless our pastor or deacon with rest.

Encourage and provide resources for pastors to rest. (Every seven years a pastor needs a sabbatical of about three months and vacation time in between.)

5. Most important...PRAY for Father John and Deacon John. Go to church ready to learn and ready to appreciate our pastor and deacon. *"You offered us an example of the kind of faith to live a life of holy dedication to a God who freely gives."*

First Reading - Wisdom 7:7-11

When Solomon, one of Israel's greatest kings, began his reign, God invited him to pray for anything he wanted. He prayed only for *wisdom*, and it was granted to him. In today's passage from the book of Wisdom, the author portrays Solomon speaking of this gift.

Second Reading - Hebrews 4:12-13

A unique feature of the Letter to the Hebrews is an extended reflection on selected Old Testament texts. This is because both Jews and Christians believe that the Scriptures are not a dead letter but are always spoken "live" to us by God. Using the image of the sword, the author describes how God's word cuts right to the heart of our daily lives.

Holy Family Parish St. Vincent de Paul Society - Report of Activities for 2017 - 2018

Your St. Vincent de Paul Conference completed the 2017-18 fiscal year on September 30th.

Because of your continued prayerful and financial support, this proved to be a most successful year.

For this we are deeply grateful and wish to share a brief summary of our activities. As you may be aware,

SVDP has a number of components within its ministry, including the following. *HFP SVDP President Ray Kelly*



OUTREACH Some 15+ volunteers pick up donated furniture, maintain an inventory and deliver to needy clients. Representatives conduct visits to the client's home to determine the need and to make delivery schedule arrangements. In addition to need assessment, SVDP is able to direct people to other agencies. **In 2018, Outreach served 525 clients.** This included 223 children and 62 seniors. **Representatives conducted 200 home visits.** We attempt to give our fellow Holy Family parishioners an idea of the individual contact experience via monthly accounts in the bulletin. **Volunteers include: Alice Brown, Kevin Dineen, Pete Dobrozsi, Dale Gerber, Tom Hackett, Penny Herr, Don Kelley, Mary Anne Kelley, Paul Mosko, Sandi Mulligan, Paul Nicholas, Ed Opbroek, Sandy Ongkiko, JoAnn Praete and Vicki Sennet.**

HELP LINE As the name suggests, volunteers offer a telephone contact for clients in need of financial assistance with water bills and/or rent. Additionally, clients receive reference to other social service agencies depending on their need. Volunteers are available on a Monday through Friday basis and work from their homes. **For the fiscal year, 521 requests were received at an expenditure of \$36,985.** This represents an increase of 26.5% over 2017 when 508 requests were received at an expense of \$29,221.

PANTRY This component has been with our Conference since its inception in 1961. It continues to grow as we are experiencing, as with other Conference components and social agencies, an increase in the number of working poor. **In 2018 we served 3,499 clients, (1,227 families including 635 seniors and 1,107 children) at an expense of \$14,549,** an increase of 13% in expenses over 2017 when 3,460 clients were served. **Pantry volunteers include: John Blake, Larry Bober, Paul Bruggeman, Bob Dorenbusch, Jerry Forshay, Ray Kelly, Mike Klapheke, Laura Niemer, Ken Patrick, Mike Platt, Frank & Judy Pressler, Tom Sauer, Jan Scaglione, Dave Schul, Jim VonderHaar, Jerry & Lillian Witt and Ray Witte.** A major contributor of the Pantry is **Needler's Fresh Market**, who donates bread and pastries five days a week.

OTHER COMPONENTS

BACK PACK Delivering lunches provided by Family Services to school children, **John Lyons and Mike Wade** have been involved in this for several years. **In 2018 this**

expense was \$999 as we assume the expense for St. John XXIII youngsters.

INFANT FORMULA Working with the Community Pregnancy Center, SVDP, through **Jean Platt**, purchase and deliver the formula for their distribution. **This amounted to \$3,572 in 2018.**

PRISON MINISTRY Mike Kelley and Charlie Disney serve as leaders for this component, providing spiritual service for Butler County and Middletown inmates.

GIVING TREE Alice Brown with Janice Markey guide this activity. **328 clients benefitted** on Thanksgiving and Christmas with dinners and gifts.

SUPPORT Al Heckler serves with financial counseling. **Janet Zappia** writes donation acknowledgement letters and other support.

CONCLUSION Total donations for 2018, including four Fifth Sunday Collections, amounted to \$82,108, an increase of 13% over 2017. **However, total expenses increased 22% from \$66,331 in 2017 to \$80,967.** Not a good trend but we are in sound financial shape and will continue to properly exercise our fiduciary responsibilities to you, our wonderful supporters.

On behalf of the SVDP volunteers and the several thousand Middletown clients we serve, thank you for your continued generosity and may God Bless each of you.
