## **Health Ministry:**

Live Longer...Wrinkle Sooner Everywhere in the world the life expectancy of a woman is higher than for a men, yet on average a woman's skin looks about 15 years



older than a man's of the same age until their sixties when their "skin age" looks about the same. Why is that?

#### **Introductions to Readings**

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Isaiah 53:10-11



Our first Scripture reading contains the message of a prophet who spoke to the Jewish people during their exile in Babylon. In four different places, this prophet speaks about a "Servant of God" who will one day deliver God's people and make them great again. Because the Servant is frequently portrayed as suffering, Christians have applied this to Jesus. Today's reading is a small portion from the last and longest of these four passages.

(On Good Friday we read the entire passage.) Second Reading - Hebrews 4:14-16

The Jewish high priest was responsible for entering the holiest place in the Jerusalem temple to make sin offerings on behalf of the people. Several times, the Letter to the Hebrews emphasizes that Jesus is superior to any high priest because he has entered the *heavenly* temple, and thus has given us access to God's "Throne of Grace."

## Parishioner Jim Hemesath Serving in Haiti Again!

Jim Hemesath CRNA made his first trip to Haiti in February 2012 to assist in cataract surgeries performed by his friend, Dr. Mark Stark, OD. Parishioners may remember that in October of 2011 we donated over 600 baseball caps for Jim to take with him. These were passed out to children of an orphanage Jim and the team visited. Jim has gone on this very special medical trip to Haiti every year save one since that first trip and just returned from one that he took earlier this month. Jim and Dr. Stark and the team performed over 40 procedures, including one for this young 10 year old boy who had vision returned to his left eye after years of blindness due to an injury as a young child. When Jim and Dr. Start first made these trips they worked in very primitive surroundings but since then enough money was raised for the construction of a brand new Operating Room, as seen in the photograph. Jim hopes to join the medical team again next year, which began with a connection between Dr. Stark and a New Orleans priest who is a member of the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity.
