

Introductions to Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Deuteronomy 6:2-6



The events in today's reading take place as the Israelites are comped on the shore of the Jordan River ready to enter the Promised Land. In a lengthy farewell speck, Moses stresses that they are to remain faithful to the Lord after they have settled in their new land. The final words of this passage are especially dear to Jewish people who recite them several times a day, attach them to their doorposts, and wear them on their person.

Second Reading - Hebrews 7:23-28

There were daily sacrifices of animals in the Jerusalem temple. These were offered by many priests who, when they died, were replaced by others. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews contrasts this with Jesus whose one sacrifice on the cross was for all people of all times.

Calvary Cemetery Collection

Apparently you can't swing a cat - or bury one - in Great Britain without hitting some archeology. We watch a lot of TV this time of year; a recently discovered gem is the Amazon series Time Team. What is



essentially a SWAT team of archeological experts descends on a site with their special knowledge and equipment, and has three days' hard labor to help unravel a mystery. Anything from Paleolithic hunting camps to WWII bunkers is fair game. The most moving finds, even to seasoned scholars like the Team, are unexpected burials. Certainly England has no shortage of these; the remains of kings are discovered under car parks, medieval monastic graves are unearthed when family pets are buried in back gardens - you get the idea. Archeologist Phil Harding's raucous voice drops to a reverent whisper as he cradles some tiny human bones in his hand. They've been found nestled against the foundation of an ancient church. "This child was probably buried in secret at night, by poor people who couldn't afford a proper grave," he says softly, "and now that we've found them, we will just tuck them carefully back again." And so he does, and the dig goes on. Recently I discovered an old newspaper article describing a lost cemetery here in Middletown, practically in the backyard of my childhood home on Midway Street. Who knew that as a kid I was "popping wheelies" on my bike over the graves of many of the earliest settlers in the area? Is there anything more poignant than an unmarked grave? Time passes, the families who maintained the cemeteries disappear....and then finally the cemetery itself goes the same way, possibly lost forever. That's why cemetery maintenance is so important. It's the only way we can ensure that the graves of our loved ones are cared for in the way they deserve, and why the Calvary Cemetery Board is requesting, as it does every year at this time, your continued support for the care of our own Catholic Cemetery. You'll find an envelope for your contribution - our only source of income - along with your November envelopes. Thank you for remembering those who helped shape our parish. 
