

# Health Ministry: Tired? Fatigued? Exhausted? Possible Causes....

complaints heard by doctors. It's a symptom of an underlying condition, not a disease in itself. Tiredness may have a physical cause, a mental cause, or both. Here are some questions that are often asked to uncover the cause: Have you started a new exercise / diet program? Recent work changes (extended hours, night shift)? Any new stress (death in family, teenager rebellion, work pressure, financial problems, divorce)? Taking any new medications? Do you get tired at certain times (after interacting with a certain person, after take medication)? Any use of illegal or not prescribed drugs, herbal products or other supplements? Underlying medical conditions? - Metabolism or hormonal problems (diabetes, anemia, kidney function) - Infections such as pneumonia, hepatitis, TB, malaria - Heart or lung problem (heart disease, heart failure, heart valve problems) - Cancer, therapies such as chemo or radiation, autoimmune diseases. Or, it could be as obvious as lack of sleep, poor diet, sedentary life style, high sugar intake, an alcoholic drink before bed (get less REM sleep), dehydration, getting older...and the list goes on. ## **Introductions to Readings**

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - 1 Kings 17:10-16



The prophet Elijah lived about 800 years before Christ. After predicting a drought which did, in fact, take place, he fled to a place where God provided for his needs. Later, God directed him to the city of Zarephath, which was across the northern border of Israel in the pagan territory of Phoenicia. The drought had led to a famine and we see its effects in today's passage.

## Second Reading - Hebrews 9:24-28

On Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement), the high priest sacrificed a goat on the altar in the temple. Then he took some of the blood into the holiest place in the temple sanctuary where only he was allowed to go. There, he sprinkled that blood covenant made at Mount Sinai, and prayed that God would forgive all the sins the people had committed during the previous year. This ritual is the backdrop for today's reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.





This month the furniture outreach ministry was able to assist an elderly gentleman who had recently moved back to Middletown with nothing but his car to be with family.



When we met him, it was obvious he was an industrious person who proudly showed us his newly rented apartment and told us of his plans to paint and clean the entire space as soon as his landlady supplied the paint. His young adult grandson was planning to live with him in this one bedroom second floor apartment. SVDP delivered a donated double bed with all bedding and a recliner later on that same day for this gentleman. Even though we intended to donate a couch for his living area for his grandson to use at night, after much discussion and measuring by our knowledgeable volunteers it was determined to be impossible to maneuver a couch into the side door and up the stairs. Knowing that a loveseat could not accommodate this young man, we delivered a purchased single bed complete with linens for him to use. We were then able to provide another upholstered chair, end table, and lamp so they could still use this large area for its intended purpose. We didn't forget a dresser, all kitchen items, kitchen chair and table, and his one personal requested item - a microwave. All of these items were donations from parishioners and friends of parishioners save one item - the purchased single bed! We left him on delivery day with an enthusiastic "Welcome back to Middletown!"
