God's Word Today

Last week's Gospel offered us the story of the young man who asked the Lord what more he needed to do to enter eternal life. This week James and John ask the Lord not for what more they can do, but what more Jesus is going to do for them, since they are such faithful disciples. Their arrogance is quickly addressed by the Lord, who lets them know in no uncertain terms that whoever wishes to be great must become the servant of others. Once again what our society values is quite simply turned on its head by the Gospel. One of the best examples of what it means to serve is one of the titles that is used to describe the pope: "Servant of the Servants of God." Even the one who is at the top of the hierarchy in the Church is called to be the servant of others. As we listen to today's readings, let us pray that we will continue to be formed as true Christian servants.

So, I'm back from my time away. It was a good time. I'd like to share with you some of what I learned while I was away. And thanks to technology, these thoughts were dictated in my car! How awesome is that?

First, I learned about life balance. As I visited Jane-Ellen and Jay Kutchka as well as their four children, Claire, Caroline, Andrew, and Leah, I was reminded of our great love and affection for each other. At the same time, as I've often teased them, the real reason I visit is that I'm doubting my priesthood. I live with their family life for a couple of days and I realize that priesthood is not so bad! Really, it reminded me to keep my life balanced between my work for the Bishop, the Worship Office, the parish, and myself. It is a very delicate balance. Let us pray about that together and for each other!

Second, I learned about the liturgical life of the Church. At the conference in Dallas of the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions, I was reminded of the transformative value of the Mass. The Eucharist is central to what we believe as Catholics. We are to be transformed through the celebration of Mass. Yet are we? When you or I come to Mass, are we different people when we leave? It was something that really struck me to the core. I tried really hard to pray about that when attending Mass last Sunday as a "person".

Finally, I learned about hospitality. Of course there is always great hospitality at hotels. There was big hospitality at the conference. (You do know that everything is bigger in Texas!) However there was little hospitality at Saint Joseph Parish in Madison, TN last Sunday. One of their values is hospitality. However, I found very little. I was not greeted at the door. I had to find my way to the restroom. I had to find the Mass setting for myself. All of it reminded me of what hospitality really requires. You and I need to make sure that people know what's going on as they visit our community as we value a Christian attitude.

So, let's get to work. We still have much to accomplish!

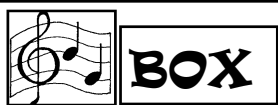

Did you know that singing as part of a group might help improve your health? Studies have shown that when people sing together

with others their overall well-being is improved, even more than people who participate in team sports. There is even evidence that singing can improve the symptoms of Parkinson’s, depression, and lung disease. While the reasons for these benefits are not completely understood, research has suggested that singing may increase oxygen levels in the blood, and triggers the release of oxytocin, a hormone that lowers blood pressure and reduces stress. Now you have a few more good reasons to “Be Not Afraid” to raise your voice and “Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow”!

Halloween Event

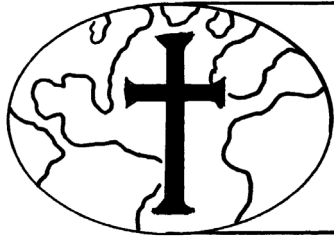

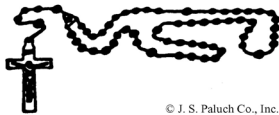
